A tuition-free summer experience to strengthen your child's academic skills and opportunities for the future

Horizons at SCH is part of a national network of 60+ Horizons summer programs offering free academic support and enrichment activities to students in Kindergarten-8th grade to help them realize their potential and avoid the learning loss that often happens over summer.

- Established in 1964, the Horizons program has a proven track record of preparing its students for success. Students gain 8-12 weeks on average in reading and math over the summer (compared to the 8-12 -week loss most children experience).
- The Horizons at SCH program has been created in partnership with the Henry H. Houston School and will support its students.
- Beginning this summer, 15 Houston Kindergarten students will be accepted to participate in the 6-week program held on the campus of SCH Academy in Chestnut Hill.
- Each subsequent summer, a new class of Kindergartners will join the program and current students will return, advancing to the next level, up through 8th grade.

Program Details:

- Program runs from July 5-August 13.
- Hours: 8:30 am - 3:30 pm weekdays
- Breakfast, lunch and snacks will be provided
- Classes taught by SCH faculty
- Program includes academic classes, field trips, enrichment activities, and outdoor excursions into the Wissahickon.

Requirements for Participating:

- Ability to pick up and drop off at SCH Academy
- No family vacations during the 6-weeks of the program
- Commitment to long-term participation of your child
- Your child has a strong school attendance record and good behavior
