18		The Board reserves the right to prohibit the posting or distribution of non-	18
19		school materials containing unprotected expression and to prohibit	19
20		students from engaging in other unprotected student expression, as well	20
21		as to stop unprotected student expression when it occurs. The Board	21
22		reserves the right to discipline students for engaging in unprotected	22
23		expression. In order to discipline students for unprotected expression	23
24		that occurs off campus and away from school functions, the Board must	24
25		establish a nexus between the unprotected expression and a substantial	25
26		and material disruption, or reasonably foreseeable substantial and	26
27		material disruption, of the school program. Factors that contribute to a	27
28		nexus between unprotected expression and disruption of the school	28
29		program include, but are not limited to, whether the expression is	29
30	Title 22	accessible to students on campus by electronic or other means; whether	30

32		equipment; and whether the expression can be quickly replicated or	32

37		The Board requires that students who wish to distribute or post non-	37
38		school materials on school property shall submit them two weeks in	38
39		advance of planned distribution or posting to the building principal or	39
40		designee, who shall forward a copy to the Superintendent.	40

42		If the non-school materials contain unprotected expression as stated in	42
43		this policy, the building principal or designee shall notify the students	43
44		that they may not post or distribute the materials because the materials	44
45		constitute a violation of Board policy.	45
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1		Students who post or distribute non-school materials in compliance	1
2		with this provision may still be ordered to desist such distribution if the	2
3		materials are later found to be unprotected expression under this policy.	3

		non-school materials, students may post such items as well, if the	
13		materials do not constitute unprotected expression and the items are	13
14		submitted for prior review in the same manner as if the students were	14
15		going to distribute them.	15

18		materials within ten (10) days of the posting or other reasonable time as	18
19		stated in the administrative regulations or procedures relating to	19
