Purpose SC 1327, 1330	The Board of Education requires that school aged pupils enrolled in the schools of this District attend school regularly in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth. The educational program offered by this District is predicated upon the presence of the pupil, which is required for continuity of instruction and classroom participation. Excessive student absence is disruptive of the educational process and, therefore, harmful to our students and to our society. The regular contact of pupils with one another in the classroom and participation in a well-planned instructional activity under the tutelage of a competent teacher are vital to this purpose. This policy is hereby adopted in coordination with the intended goal of this School District to eliminate unnecessary and excessive student absence. Authority	Resident children shall be entitled to attend the District's public schools from the earliest admission age to the District's kindergarten school program until the age of 21 years. School attendance is compulsory from the time the child enters the lowest grade of an elementary school above kindergarten, which shall be not later than at the age of eight years, until the age of 17 or graduation from a regularly accredited senior high school. Beginning with the 2020-2021 School Year, compulsory school age will be defined as from the time the parent or guardian places the student in school, which shall be no later than six (6) years of age until the student reaches eighteen (18) years of age, unless the student has graduated from school. No student shall be admitted to the District's schools who has attained a high school diploma or its equivalent unless such student is part of a foreign exchange program. Full Attendance Required - Students are required by law to be in full attendance each school day unless absent for an approved reason, which is defined herein as an excused absence. Any absence not approved shall be deemed to be an unexcused absence and determine when an absence is unexcused. Excused Absences - The guidelines governing excused absences are established by the Department of Education and may be found in Chapter II of Title 22 of the Pennsylvania Code. The parents of a student are responsible to see that each child is in lawful school attendance. Therefore, any request that an absence be approved as an excused absence must be requested, in writing, from a parent.
