Dear YES Prep Families,

It's hard to believe that it's been **a year** since COVID-19 surfaced in Houston and forced a new reality. The challenges the virus brought were impossible to predict, but what remained clear was our shared commitment to our YES Prep community. No matter what, we prioritized health and safety for all. Online or in person, we remained committed to rigorous education and success for every student on their path to college and beyond.

It has not been an easy year, but there is still so much to celebrate. Here are a few highlights from this past year and our response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- We secured devices and internet hot spots for every student who needed it.
- We launched our [Keep YES Prep Learning Fund](#), which provides emergency assistance to students and alumni impacted financially by the pandemic.
- YES Prep teachers and staff helped seniors stay focused and ready for AP exams, which help them earn college credit and save on tuition. Seniors complete admissions, financial aid and scholarship applications, and much more.
- We initiated a [social-emotional learning](#) program for students. Our student support counselors and health partners continued their work supporting students.
- YES Prep alumni advisors supported thousands of YES Prep graduates, most of whom are among the first in their families to go to college. These alumni advisors worked around the clock to do everything they could to keep a pandemic from standing in the way of students' college dreams.
- At the beginning of 2021, we established districtwide afterschool tutorials for students in special education to mitigate the loss of critical skills for our most vulnerable students learning virtually.
- We now [deliver breakfasts and lunches for all seven days of the week to 8,500 Houston-area homes with students learning online](#). These home deliveries eliminate the need for families to pick up meals from their children's campuses.

We want to assure you that YES Prep is committed to helping students and families in any way we can. We are full of gratitude for how our families and students have persisted through this unprecedented time.

YES Prep System-Wide Grading Policy Changes

YES Prep has made the following system-wide adjustments to its 2020-2021 Grading Policy, effective immediately, to further pursue mastery-based and equity-driven grading policies and to better position YES Prep students for success and college-options in this era of pandemic-schooling. - The floor for all attempted district assessments in Q3 and Q4 (Common Assessments and Unit Exams) will be increased to 60% (Regular and Accommodated versions) and 65% (Modified versions).
- The grading floor for all attempted work in Q3 and Q4 will be increased to 60%. Missing work and assignments with confirmed honor code violations will remain floored at a 50%.
- Final Q3 and Q4 Common Assessment scores between 61%-100% (Regular and Accommodated versions) and 66%-100% (Modified versions) will replace all grades in the gradebook for that quarter that are lower. However, assignments with confirmed honor code violations and missing assignments will remain floored at 50%. *Please note that for our Spring Branch ISD partnership campuses this will only apply during Q4.*
- For the 2020-2021 school year all final grades of “F” in high school credit courses will be reported on transcripts as No Credit (“NC”) and will be excluded from GPA calculations. Students who earn No Credit (“NC”) in a class may be required to enroll in and pass a corresponding makeup class in order to be promoted to the next grade level or graduate. This will be determined by the determined by the RPC committee, Dean of Students, and/or College Counselor in accordance with YES Prep promotion standards and graduation requirements, as allowed by the Texas Education Agency and the Texas Education Code.

Quarter 4 Program Selection Survey – Available March 8-26

We look forward to hearing from you on your selection of online or in-person learning for next quarter. Reminder, if you wish to have your student in the same learning program for Q4, you do not need to complete the survey again. We recognize this year has been incredibly difficult for many families, and there are many factors to consider when deciding between in-person and online learning. We have a full-scale effort to welcome students for in person learning with health and safety measures to do everything we can to help keep the virus out of our schools, including:

- Required use of facial coverings over mouth and nose
- Social distancing whenever possible
- Health and temperature checks for students and staff before getting onto campus each day
- Regular hand washing while on campus
- Safety protocols on school buses
- In addition to the standard daily cleaning protocols, schools undergo intense disinfecting
- Strict adherence to CDC and state guidelines for isolating at home after a student or staffer is infected or exposed to someone infected
- Rapid testing for any staff member or any student, as approved by families, who may experience a known COVID symptom
- Anyone showing symptoms is immediately separated, and areas used by that person are cleaned and disinfected
- No non-essential visitors allowed on any campus

For students who remain online, attendance and active engagement in every class, every day will directly impact their academic success, especially as we approach STAAR testing and other critical milestones this school year. You can track your child’s progress online by monitoring grades and attendance in Skyward and viewing daily assignments and activities on Teams.

Online or in person, we remain firmly committed to the rigorous education and success of your children on their path to college and beyond. Many families have reported—since their students returned in person—that they were better able to concentrate, with fewer distractions and opportunities to leave the class or miss assignments.
