

As you can see, at this point our campus community is overwhelming comfortable with the idea of Middle School and Secondary School students returning to campus full time.

#### **Move to On-Campus Learning for All Students**

The plan to integrate middle school and secondary school students back on campus full time does not affect our preschool school or elementary school students as they are already on campus full time. The only possible exception to this would be the 5yo classes. We are looking at how to bring more middle school and secondary students back on campus daily in step-by-step process. This means not all students would return at the same time. The KIS administrative team is preparing a plan to propose to QSI Headquarters, the Advisory Board, and school staff.

KIS will have an open forum meeting to discuss the results of our survey and our phase-by-phase proposal on **Thursday**, **March 4th**.



For DELF Junior, you may be registered in March. In this case, you will attend your exam:


5 April - A1 and A2,


### San Valentín Valentine's CARDS IN SPANISH






The most interesting summaries were rewarded.

During one of our online practice tests, that we participated in last week, one of the Mathelets was traveling home in the family van. He was so committed to being in the challenge event that he logged on with his cell phone and did the practice event while in the van. Now that's commitment. The Internet was poor and he had trouble with his log in, but he did not give up and completed the competition.


All of our students are keen to learn the mathematics and are rigorous participants in all our weekly meetings. Here's an example of an activity that we do to warm up. Using order of operations, and mathematical processes like square roots and factorial, use the first four numbers in an order of operations equation to equal the last number in the following list. Look up Krypto on line and have some fun with numbers. 6, 10, 18, 21 to give the answer of 7.
