The TAC does not make specific recommendations for the types of devices or services to be used, rather TAC defines the main goals and outcomes the Levy will support.

Think "mobile devices for our youngest learners" rather than "iPads" or "Surfaces".

Over the course of our time together, we will review the ideas that have come forth from a variety of sources, prioritize them, and then build a recommendation for the Board to take action on in the form of a Resolution.
