School Targets

- Target 1: 70% of students in all student groups enrolled in grades 3-4-5 will achieve proficiency as measured on the 2022 MCAP Math assessment.
 - **Rationale:** 2019 MCAP Math assessment
 - 3rd Grade: 51% proficient
 - 4th Grade: 45% proficient
 - 5th Grade: 65% proficient

- Target 2: 60% of students in all student groups enrolled in grades 3-4-5 will achieve proficiency as measured on the 2022 MCAP Reading assessment.
 - **Rationale:** 2019 MCAP Reading assessment
 - 3rd Grade: 52% proficient
 - 4th Grade: 31% proficient
 - 5th Grade: 37% proficient
- Target 3: 95% of students in all student groups enrolled in grades PreK-K-1-2-3-4-5 will receive 0-1 referrals during School Year 2022 as measured by discipline referral data entered.
 - o Rationale: 2019 Discipline Data
 - 1st Quarter: 54 referrals by 28 students
 - 2nd Quarter: 55 referrals by 36 students
 - 3rd Quarter: 120 referrals by 65 students
 - 4th Quarter: 157 referrals by 69 students
 - Total: 381 referrals by 114 students
 - 43 students had 1 referral
 - 595 out of 666 students had 0-1 referrals which is 89%

Strategies

Target 1:

- Unpack standards to ensure that all students are taught to the standard
- Use Number Talk Routines to increase reasoning skills
- Use MAP Skills to identify and progress monitor skill areas of weakness for students

Evidence:

- Administration will collect data related to standards addressed in classes and cross-check it with county pacing guides/curriculum. The expectation is that 85% of classes will be compliant
- Quarterly, teachers will submit their completed number talk routines to their SIT representative
- Monitor progress through FLEX group data collection tool

Results:

2020 MCAP Math was not given as schools were closed due to COVID-19

Target 2:

- Unpack standards to ensure that all students are taught to the standard
- Use MAP Growth to identify students scoring in the bottom two quintiles. Conduct data conferences with grade level teams including special educators to design targeted instruction within the classroom and during FLEX groups
- Small group instruction that meets the needs of all student groups

Evidence:

- Administration will collect data related to standards addressed in classes and cross-check it with county pacing guides/curriculum. The expectation is that 85% of classes will be compliant
- Quarterly, teachers will submit their completed number talk routines to their SIT representative
- Monitor progress through FLEX group data collection tool

Results:

2020 MCAP Reading was not given as schools were closed due to COVID-19

Target 3:

- All teachers will teach, model, and practice routines and procedures with all students
- All teachers will develop classroom rules/expectations with the class
- All teachers will use restorative practices when inappropriate behaviors are exhibited in the classroom

Evidence:

- 50% of students will be able to explain a classroom routine/procedure to an observer.
- 75% of classrooms will have a visual display of rules/expectations posted by October 1st
- Students will respond to the climate survey given quarterly in a positive manner regarding student to student respect

Results:

2020 Discipline Data

- 1st quarter: 75 referrals by 44 students
- 2nd quarter: 117 referrals by 58 students
- 3rd quarter: 80 referrals by 48 students
- 4th quarter: 0 (schools closed due to COVID-19)
- Total: 272 referrals by 96 students
- 44 students had 1 referral
- 632 out of 658 students had 0-1 referrals which is 96%
