## THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all district employees and students. In pursuit of this goal, the district will comply with all occupational health and safety standards including training its employees, and, when appropriate, directing students to identify risks of exposure; implementing practices of exposure control including following Universal Precautions; responding to and reporting exposure incidents; and keeping detailed records of cases of exposure.

The purpose of this policy is to eliminate or minimize exposure to bloodborne pathogens within district facilities.

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status. The district is committed to providing equal access and equal opportunity in its programs, services and employment including its policies, complaint processes, program accessibility, district facility use, accommodations and other Equal Employment Opportunity matters.
