THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education strives to ensure that all webpages within the district's Web space are accessible to the widest range of users, including those with disabilities. All district personnel who are involved in the procurement, preparation, and maintenance of the district's websites and web-based applications are dedicated to supporting Web accessibility.

The district is committed to complying with all applicable state and federal laws so that users with disabilities are able to independently acquire the same information, engage in the same interactions, and enjoy the same benefits and services within the same timeframe as those without disabilities, with substantially equivalent ease of use. The district will act to ensure that users with disabilities are not excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination in any district programs, services, or activities delivered online. To that end, the district's websites and webbased applications will comply with, at a minimum, the standards outlined in Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. In the event that any user has difficulty accessing the district's webpages, the district has established procedures to address all website accessibility concerns, complaints, and grievances.

The purpose of this policy is to provide accessibility to the district's websites for individuals with disabilities.

The district will set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying <u>administrative</u> <u>procedures</u>.

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status. The district is committed to providing equal access and equal opportunity in its programs, services and employment including its policies, complaint processes, program accessibility, district facility use, accommodations and other Equal Employment Opportunity matters. The district also provides equal access to district facilities for all youth groups listed in Title 36 of the United States Code, including scouting groups.
