THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education complies with all state requirements regarding the development of school calendars. Calendar options are developed in accordance with guidelines established by the Utah State Board of Education and shall be approved by the board. Recognizing that the scheduling and coordinating of district activities is an important administrative function, the board delegates to the superintendent and district administration the responsibility to develop school calendars in accordance with the above-referenced Parameters for District Calendars document. The Parameters for District Calendars document fully details the district's transparent process for developing calendar options and includes guidance to schools on how to tailor the approved calendars to meet their individual needs. A district calendar committee may be formed to make recommendations to the administration and the board regarding calendar preparation.

The purpose of this policy is to guide the consideration, modification, and adoption of school calendars to best meet the needs of students, families, and district staff.
