THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education recognizes the need and importance of providing students with an appropriate, supportive, and factual sex education curriculum. To that end, the board requires that all instructional materials, speakers, special programs, and resource agencies used in any sex education presentation or discussion be reviewed and approved by the Salt Lake City School District Human Sexuality Curriculum Committee and approved annually by the board. The district will follow all provisions of state law when teaching any aspect of sex education, including the parent/guardian notification and prior written parental consent requirements. Educators must also complete all USBE training requirements specific to sex education curriculum and instruction.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that the district's sex education curriculum and instruction are fully compliant with state law.

The district will set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
