THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education has established adult education programs in the district to provide adults with educational opportunities to learn English, improve their literacy levels, and complete coursework to obtain a high school completion diploma. The board recognizes that these programs allow individuals to acquire the academic skills necessary to improve their personal, social, and economic well-being. To that end, the district offers a variety of adult education classes for Utah residents in accordance with state law.

The purpose of this policy is to promote, develop, and support programs and courses that provide educational opportunities for adults and eligible minors.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).
