## Calvert County Public Schools Online Program

Calvert County Public Schools (CCPS) offers online learning opportunities as alternatives for gaining original credit or recovering credit. Only students enrolled in a CCPS high school may participate in the CCPS Online Learning Program. Students have two options for participating in online courses, courses offered through CCPS for original or credit recovery and courses offered through Edmentum/Apex Learning Virtual School (ALVS), a Maryland approved vendor for credit recovery only.

Credit Recovery is defined as the opportunity to retake a course in which the student previously was not academically successful in earning credit towards graduation.

## **CCPS** Online Courses

Students in grades 10, 11, 12 and second semester 9th-grade students are eligible to enroll in online courses offered by CCPS. Students should refer to the Course Offering Guide to identify which courses are offered online. These courses can be taken for original credit, or for credit recovery.

- Enrollment in a CCPS Online Course is limited to those courses that have been approved by Calvert County Public Schools and is noted in the Course Offering Guide.
- All course work must be completed by the last student day of the semester or the year in which the student enrolls.
- The grade from the online course will be reflected on the student's report card and transcript.
- All students enrolled in a CCPS Online Course will be assigned a mentor.
- Students must complete the Online Learning Interest Survey prior to starting a CCPS Online Course. Students may elect to complete the CCPS Online Orientation course to become familiar with learning activities found in online courses.
- Some online courses have a required face-to-face component. Meetings may be held after school, evenings, weekends, or held virtually depending on course content. Please refer to the Course Offering Guide for the courses that require face-to-face meetings.
- Students scheduled for more than 7 credits within a given school year will be charged a fee of \$325 for a one-credit course and \$225 for a half-credit course (this includes a \$25 non-refundable fee).
- Generally, the online courses offered every school year are:

Foundations of Computer Science (1 cr)

Foundations of Technology (1 cr)
Financial Literacy (.5 cr - Fall and Spring)
Health I and II (.5 cr – Fall and Spring)
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Health I and II (.5 cr) Foundations of Computer Science (1 cr) Foundations of Technology (1 cr) Music Appreciation (Seniors ONLY - 1 cr)

## CCPS Online Edmentum/ALVS Credit Recovery Courses

Students who have completed grade 9, 10, or 11 and have failed to earn credit in one or more courses may decide to take the course again online through Edmentum/Apex Learning Virtual School (ALVS), a Maryland State Department of Education and CCPS approved vendor.

- Before enrolling in a course through ALVS, students must submit the CCPS Online ALVS Credit Recovery Student Participation Request Form and receive approval from. This ensures that the course is still approved prior to officially enrolling in the course. There is no cost for a credit recovery course.
- Please refer to CCPS Online Learning Website for approved CCPS credit recovery courses offered through ALVS.
- The ALVS course enrollment must be completed by December 15<sup>th</sup> of each year.
- All students enrolled in an ALVS course will be assigned a mentor.
- Credit will not be awarded for online student courses if CCPS has not provided approval for course enrollment.
- Once enrolled in an ALVS course, students will have a maximum of 20 weeks to complete all course work. The 20-week course includes two – 10-week sessions. Courses must be completed by May 15<sup>th</sup> to generate a final grade for the course.
- Students participating in an ALVS course are required to complete the end of session exams in a face-to-face setting with their online mentor.
- The final grade from the credit recovery is calculated in the student's GPA. The attempted credit from the original course will be zeroed out, however, the course will still show on the student's transcript.
