Director's Letter

Dear QSI Families,

We are excited to have the rest of the students return to campus next week. Everyone on campus is ready to return to face-to-face instruction.

For the past two weeks, the younger students have been on campus. YEAH! The students have done an amazing job returning to the regular schedule. It is thrilling to see all the work they have completed and posted around the school. While the two weeks have been successful, I would like to encourage the families to talk with the children on how the return to school has been for them.

The suggestion to talk with your child extends beyond the younger ages. For the older students returning, it is also encouraged that parents talk with their children about retuning to school after several weeks of distance learning. While they are excited to return to see friends and teachers, the older students will be adjusting to the school's on campus academic schedule. The changes back to lessons on campus involve packing up all the items needed for the day's lessons to wearing a mask while

on campus. The mixture of excitement (of seeing friends in person) and change in daily routines may create some uneasiness with your child.

Even though COVID has been present for over a year, talking about it with children is still new to us all. There is no official book on how to talk with your child on this topic. What is available to us as parents and educators, are frequent topics to be aware of when children return to school after some distance learning. Below is a short 2-minute video that identifies some topics you may want to discuss with your children before or after their return to campus.

Reminders:

- I've reprinted the earlier announcement from this week below. Please review. It has important information about returning.
- The older kids need to know that the spot for line up has switched with the younger kids. Please remind them.
- Remind all of your children to talk with the teachers about any comfort needs in regard to schedule and needing fresh air outside.


Again, we are all excited to receive your children next week and have our campus alive with learning!

Talking with your child about returning to school




Important information on returning to campus (from previous e-mail) As we make this transition back to campus, please review the information below:

- Masks:
 - Medical masks are the expectation for all individuals on campus.
 - Students should bring extra masks to change during the day.
 - Please review this video with your child so they are reminded of how a mask should fit: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=05FEAJh_tNE&t=54s</u>

- As students transition back to wearing the masks long-term on campus, the teachers will arrange various mask breaks that are outside. If your child is needing a break, all they need to do is speak with the teacher and some form of break will be arranged.
- There is a mask exception for ages 3-13 in certain situations. If you find medical masks that do not fit your 3-13 year-old properly, an everyday mask can be worn. Please make sure the everyday mask covers the face properly.
- Secondary 1-4 MUST wear a medical mask.
- Remind older students to line up on the other side of the door in the morning.
- Ventilation in the room:
 - Airflow in a room is our biggest ally in fighting COVID. Windows will be opened frequently.
 - Please make sure your child is dressed in layers to adjust to varying temperatures.
- Family Illness
 - To maintain a safe and healthy learning environment, please review the flowchart in the school newsletter on what to do when a family member shows COVID symptoms.
- The first week back
 - For the returning students, this is the longest they have participated in distance learning with QSI Munster. Returning back to school will need some adjustment time.
 - The teachers will spend time checking in on students' mental well-being, provide time for students to reconnect with other students, and review the work completed over the past several weeks.
- 10 YO to Secondary students with personal digital devices.
 - Students need to bring their personal devices fully charged each day.
 - Students should bring charging cords to school.
 - It is recommended that an external battery pack is also brought to school.
