Director's Letter

Dear QSI Families,

With Germany's "lockdown light" in place, our campus is still thriving with learning. Elementary students are outside planting bulbs for next spring's bloom and middle school students recorded their holiday performance. We are able to create this vibrant learning environment because our community is working together during the "lockdown light". As we move forward through the last 4 weeks of school before the holiday break, I would like to encourage our community in staying vigilant by following Germany's "lockdown light" expectations. It would be an amazing accomplishment to provide students with uninterrupted access to QSI's face-to-face classroom instruction from August to December. In addition, thanks to the families who contact the school to clarify any unique COVID situations. With strong communication, we are able to provide the safest learning environment for the QSI students.

In connection to providing the safest learning environment, the school will not be hiring an outside photographer for the annual class and student photos. Having a person outside of our school community spend all day taking pictures does have a certain level of increased risk. Beyond the safety aspect, I received feed back on past photos from families that the cost was too high, the payment process was challenging, and the quality of some of the photos was not satisfactory. To address the safety aspect and parent concerns, the school will complete the pictures "in house".

We are fortunate to have a staff member, Mr. Josh, with extensive training in photography and will navigate our photo sessions. The school has ordered lights and a backdrop for the photos. Some secondary students helped select the backdrop color; it will not be the "passport" blue color that was used in the past. Mrs. Ketz and Mrs. Garner are volunteering to help organize the ordering of the photos. More information will come on the ordering process. The tentative individual photo date is December 10th. There will not be a set date for the class photo. For the safest group photo, the class photo will be taken outside on a day with good weather and all students are present in class. While much of the changes to the annual photo day is because COVID is still present in our current lives, we can still capture school memories through photos in a safe environment.

Lastly, the calendar for the next academic school year has been approved by QSI. Your input on holiday adjustments via the survey is greatly appreciated. It helped create the calendar for next year. The 2021-2022 calendar can be viewed following this letter.
