Director's Letter

Dear QSI Families,

The campus was buzzing with excitement this week. The 3-9 YO students returned to campus for face to face instruction. It was great to see the students and parents after several weeks of distance learning. Please take the time to review the pictures of the students returning to school this week.

A frequent question I am receiving from people this week is: "Has the government shared any information regarding when 10YO and older can return to campus for face to face instruction?". I have not received any information from the NRW Department of Education about 10YO to Secondary 4

students returning to campus. I anticipate an update from the German government after the first week of March. If I hear of anything earlier, I will share the information with the QSI community.

The third quintile is completed this Friday. Next week the status reports will be e-mailed to the families. Please make sure to review the grades with your children. If a student received an Hgrade, the unit is put on hold because the student is struggling on the subject at the moment or needs to allocate more time on the work. An H grade is not final. Students can continue to work on the unit when they are ready and create a plan with the teacher.

Next week is the Director Chat and PSG meeting via Teams. The original presentation of the Director Chat was to review Microsoft's Teams video conference program. This topic will be changed to QSI's Success Orientations. Because of distance learning being implemented in January, we missed a Director Chat and PSG meeting that had the topic of Success Orientations. Since Success Orientations are a foundation of the QSI philosophy, it is important that this topic be reviewed in our meetings.

Also next week is the Success Orientation day for the 10YO to Secondary students. They will be provided with a variety of activities to work on for the day. Most of the activities will not require technology. This activity is designed to give the students a digital break while still focusing on QSI material - The Success Orientations.
























Middle School Cultural Studies completed a STEM project for their study of Asian cultures. The Zen gardens brought some relaxation to our lives.





- relationships

- protective strategies.
