## Calvert County Public Schools Exit Expectations High School Advanced Photography

All exiting Advanced Photography students should be able to do the following:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of the Elements of Art and Principles of Design.
- 2. Use the artistic process to imagine, plan, and create dynamic compositions.
- 3. Use drawing and painting techniques to develop a personal voice and style.
- 4. Develop a personal portfolio of original, non-plagiarized artwork.\*
- 5. Proficiently create a set of negatives which are focused, properly exposed, accurately developed, and free of scratches.
- 6. Proficiently use manual SLR cameras and digital SLR cameras.
- 7. Use basic digital editing software.
- 8. Properly use a variety of camera lenses and camera filters to further enhance subject matter (using manual and digital cameras).
- 9. Create clear and well focused black and white silver gelatin prints.
- 10. Create formal and informal portraits and still life compositions which utilize controlled lighting (using manual and digital cameras).
- 11. Use a variety of printing and developing techniques to create unique compositions: solarizing, drawing with light, liquid light and handmade negatives.
- 12. Create a photomontage using multiple negatives: Cubist, Surrealist, and Optical.
- 13. Create a digital photomontage using a photo editing software.
- 14. Use the Elements of Art and Principles of Design to analyze and understand historical artworks.
- 15. Use historical techniques and/or processes to create a personal message.
- 16. Evaluate the technical and aesthetic elements of a photograph or print.
- 17. Use the Elements of Art and the Principles of Design to formulate written and verbal assessments/critiques of personal artworks.
