Schedule Update & Spring Outlook



Collaborative Process & Review

- **Cross role advisory group of staff and student focus groups.**
- **Start and end time is consistent, M-F.**
- **Fridays will be in-person beginning on 3/19 (Week of 3/15).**
- **8:20-1:00 & 2:00-3:21 Instructional times.**
- **60 minute periods M-TH, 45 minute periods on Friday.**
- **20 minute break in the middle of (8:20-1:00) instructional day.**
- **Targeted instruction period will either be scheduled or open. Scheduled periods will be based on day of the week. Friday afternoons (2:00-3:21) will be open.**
- **Clubs and athletics will start after 3:21 to maintain equitable access for all students.**



FRIDAY

- Focused on a variety of instructional formats and formative assessments. Strong emphasis on differentiation, to address individualized needs.
- Example: Breakout Rooms
 - Small Group
 - 1 to 1/peer review
 - Independent
 - Recovery
 - PBL
- Discretion on introducing new content, zoom time, and assigning HW (to be due on Monday).
- Friday afternoons will focus on OPEN time, for students to access teachers, counselors, 9th grade in peer group, 10th grade in community service. This time could also be used for school-wide events, such as our social justice shutdown, spring fling, etc.
 - Focused on connecting with peers, mentoring & flexibility.



Targeted/Asynchronous Learning Period

- **This period provides an opportunity for all students to access a subject-specific period, to receive a variety of instructional approaches and social-emotional support. Some examples of instructional methods that may be utilized, include:**
- One on one direct instruction
- Small group instruction/discussions
- Allowing time for alternate assignments
- Improving comprehension of process and content
- Focus on social emotional connection and executive functioning deficits (organization and prioritization)
- Meeting with counselor
- Individualized conferencing/assessments
- PBL
- Opportunity to address learning loss
- Asynchronous focus/student collaboration.
- **Staff will maintain a Student Accountability Tracking Form, to track student attendance and performance.**
