Ladybird's Star of the Week is Marnie





Balmoral's Star of the Week is Samwyn




Miss Jeacock says: Samwyn has been awarded Star of the Week for super independent reading within the learning environment. Well done Samwyn.

Kensington's Star of the Week is Joel




Mrs. Russell says: Well done Joel. You are Kensington's Star of the Week for always working hard in all of your lessons.

Bishops Itchington School Solar PV Consultation

The Green Shoots funding scheme from Warwick County Council has been set up with the following aims:

Increase the adaptability and resilience of Warwickshire to the effects of climate change Reduce impacts on the environment, particularly regarding climate change Ensure funded projects benefit the wider Warwickshire community

We hope to achieve these aims by

Reducing the carbon emissions of the school and exporting excess renewably generated electricity to the national grid Increasing awareness of the important role that renewable technologies play in tackling climate change to the children and the wider community. We hope to install a display in a prominent location in the school, that reports the real time generation of the solar PV system. This can be used to support STEM lessons within the school. It will also be viewed by the wider community when the school opens its doors again for winter and summer fetes and other events.
