Sex and Relationship Policy

The Sex and Relationship Education (SRE) programme at Ysgol Nantgwyn is designed to provide pupils, at the appropriate time, with information about loving relationships, the nature of sexuality and the processes of human reproduction.

Facts are presented in an objective, balanced and sensitive manner which are set within a clear framework of values and an awareness of the law on sexual behaviour.

The programme, as agreed with the Governing Body, is linked to the requirements of the curriculum as set out by the Welsh Government. Parents may view the policy to discuss the teaching materials used and have the right to withdraw their children from sex education.

Examination Entry Policy

All pupils will be entered for external examinations with the exception of those who have been absent for a long time or through agreement with the parents or carers.

If a pupil fails to attend the examination without a good reason, the school will charge the parents or carers the cost of the entry fee. Costs for additional re-sits will be agreed on an individual basis.



Careers and Enterprise Education

The curriculum has been designed to develop a wider range of entrepreneurial skills to help pupils' understanding of the working world and economy around them; while creating opportunities for pupils to explore and apply their skills to real life sceneries and experiences.

The Careers Education Service along with School of Life provides regular sessions within the curriculum and extra advice at each transitional stage for pupils.

Our Careers Wales advisors are present at Parents' Evenings from Year 8 onwards and are available for consultation.

Work Experience

Work experience is rewarding and improves confidence and motivation which gives pupils a more realistic basis when planning careers and making decisions.

The school, working with Careers Wales, are able to find work placements for pupils even though they are encouraged to secure their own placement, relevant to their own interests and needs

School Improvement

The Welsh Government is determined to raise standards in schools throughout Wales. Challenging national targets have been set and individual local authorities and schools are required to set their own.

The targets we have set ourselves for 2018-19 and subsequent years reflect a realistic level of challenge. All staff and governors at the school work tirelessly to achieve, and hopefully exceed, them.

Complaints Procedure
