### OUR COMMUNITY

Regional School District No. 7 is composed of four rural-suburban towns: Barkhamsted, Colebrook, New Hartford and Norfolk. The district, consisting of 157 square miles, is located twenty miles west of Hartford and has a population of approximately 13,400.

### SCHOOL AND FACULTY

Northwestern Regional High School is a comprehensive public 9-12 school which operates under a House plan. Opened in 1958, the school is accredited by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. The school campus of 42 acres includes two grade 9-12 Houses. Enrollment in grades 9-12 is currently 690. Ninety-five percent of the professional staff have a Master's degree. The average class size in the academic program is 25. The school performs exceptionally well on a yearly basis scoring well above national and state averages on the SAT and AP testing. For the past two years, Northwestern has been recognized by the College Board as an AP Honor Roll School for the increase in the percentage of students taking an AP course and the high percentage of students that score a 3 or better on an AP test. According to the Connecticut State Department of Education the school is also performing well on the NextGeneration Accountability System, scoring a 92.3 on the set of 12 indicators that serve as a measure of how well the school is preparing students for college and career.

### PROGRAM/OFFERINGS

The school curriculum is both flexible and encompassing, offering numerous one-semester, as well as full-year courses at introductory through advanced levels. The school operates on an eight period A/B Block Schedule. Four different 80-minute periods meet on alternating days for thirty-six weeks per one credit course: 1/2 credit is given for a one-semester subject and 1/4 credit for each year of physical education and 1/4 credit for health. Marking periods are every 9 weeks. Laboratory work is required in all science courses. The school is academically rigorous and continually seeks to provide innovative opportunities for students. We are the first school in the state to open a bank branch inside the school. The bank is cooperatively staffed by bank employees and students who are enrolled in an Honors Banking class. The school is home to a regional Agricultural Education Program which draws students from surrounding districts.

### CREDITS AND GRADES

Students graduating in 2021 must earn 23 credits for graduation. These include 4 credits in English, 3 credits each in Mathematics, Social Studies (which must include 1 credit of U.S. History and 1/2 credit of Civics), and Science (which must include 1 credit of Biology), plus 2 credits in the arts or vocational education and one each in physical education and health. Students receiving honors must maintain at least a "B" average. All failing grades are reported on the school transcript. Students who withdraw from a semester course in the beginning 5 weeks or from a full year course in the beginning 8 weeks may have that course removed from their record without penalty. Thereafter, withdrawals are reported as a "WF" on the transcript. During distance learning in 2020 due to COVID 19, the lowest grade a student could earn in the second semester was a 50. In some instances, students received a P.

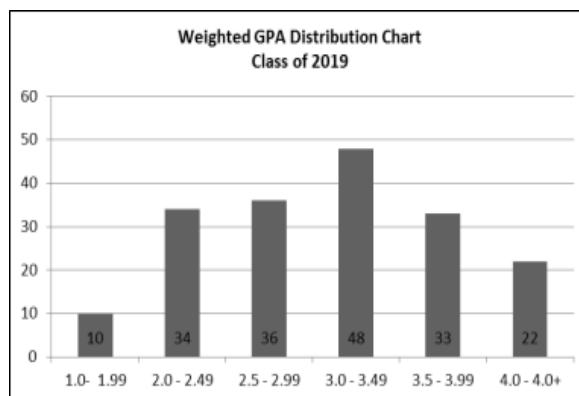

Honors courses are signified by an "H" or "Hon". A "C" or "G" following a course title indicates college preparatory or general level of difficulty respectively. University of Connecticut Early College Experience courses are signified by "UConn". Advanced Placement courses are designated by "AP".

**CLASS RANK:** Our grading system differentiates in weight between AP/UCONN, honors, college preparatory, general and remedial level course work. A weighted GPA and class rank is reported on the high school transcript at the end of six semesters. Cumulative GPA and class rank are based solely on courses completed at Northwestern Regional High School and transfer students are not included in the class ranking.
