Write the corresponding multiplication and division calculations.</p>	<p>Find out about the plants which grow in Kenya.</p>
<p>Research roman numerals up to 12.</p>	<p>Measuring trees – take a bark rubbing, measure a tree and calculate its age by counting its rings.</p>	<p>Research or investigate what plants need to survive and grow healthily.</p>
<p>Find out about the positive and negative impact humans can have on the environment.</p>	<p>Write a poem inspired by trees or plants.</p>	<p>Research different salad recipes. Look carefully at the different ingredients that are used. Where do the ingredients come from? Which is your favourite recipe? Why?</p>
<p>Practice telling the time on an analogue clock. Can you tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes? What about the nearest minute?</p>	<p>Create a timetable of your day. Can you calculate the time duration of each activity?</p>	<p>Look carefully at different trees. Can you name any? Perhaps you could use the leaves to identify them.</p>
