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Chadwick Minis Morning Activities

Our mornings begin with a “welcome,” followed by calendar and stories. The children then cycle through the following camp activities in their stable cohort groups.

Centers

Centers are theme-related activities led by a credentialed teacher or an assistant teacher. Indoor centers include structured play, science exploration, math games, and reading and writing skill development. Outdoor centers on the playground encourage fun while developing motor skills through games, rhythm and movement.

Art

Art lessons in our studio introduce students to basic art media such as paint, watercolor, and pastels, using a wide variety of materials. Projects allow for creative expression and growth.

Music

Music class fosters children's love for music by inviting Chadwick Minis to play simple instruments, and participate in dance and movement activities.

Physical Education

Chadwick Minis enjoy organized physical education activities two to three times per week out on our spacious play space. We will work on large motor skills, coordination, balance, body control, and early sport specific skills. Our focus is on cooperation, healthy competition, and team building skills.

Are you fascinated with science? This hands-on course involves exploring physical, biological, and chemical projects. FUNDamental Reading and Study Skills

This course is designed to help students improve the way they read and study academic material. Maximizing students' abilities to comprehend and retain what they read is emphasized, as are notetaking and test-taking skills. Students learn a variety of techniques that they will be able to utilize in their classes next fall.

Math Magicians

Art & Making

Let's get our Creativity on! This class will allow your student explore their creative side! We will work with different paints, colored pencils, and a variety of materials, to make unique works of art. Students will also explore design and engineering through "making activities" using found objects as we observe nature outside, inspiring our artwork. These artists will study the Elements of Art, exposing our minds to different types and styles of Art and Making!

Games

Game on! Campers use logic, reasoning, social skills, and critical thinking to play strategic board games. They will discover how game developers create board games in order to design their very own. Campers choose a theme, establish rules, directions and even design a board and game pieces. Then, we play!

Music & Movement

Let's get moving! Campers will explore music and movement from around the world connecting their bodies and their minds with rhythms and steps from a variety of cultures.

Sports

Campers participate in both gym and field sports. In the gym campers play basketball, handball, jump rope, and more.

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Prep Plus Schedule Information

Chadwick Summer Prep Plus Program will take an Online Distance Learning approach to provide our students with additional support and further skill acquisition and enhance the areas of Language Arts and Mathematics. The program will be using virtual synchronous and asynchronous learning strategies. The learning environment will utilize an academic schedule each day through a virtual online platform. During the daily meetings, the teacher will provide direct instruction and facilitate discussion. **All students are expected to attend all live (online) sessions and interact with the instructor and other students.** In addition to class meetings, the instructor will post assignments for students to complete outside of the live (online) meeting times and submit assignments electronically. Students will be assessed based on class participation, completion of work, and demonstrated understanding of class content through tests/quizzes. Students requesting the in-person full-course load are able to be on campus, supervised by counselors as they remote into their classes throughout the academic school day (9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.).

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ENRICHMENT COURSES (Enrichment Courses meet from 9:00 a.m. – 9:50 a.m.)

Computer Coding [GRADES 6 & 7]

In this day and age, computer programming is the "it" thing to do. Facebook has an app. Twitter has an app. iMovie has an app. Those apps and more were all created by someone who learned computer programming. Scratch is a great way to learn the fundamental concepts of programming languages. In this class, you will explore how to create games, animations, stories, and art using a computer learning tool that teaches programming skills.

Debate [GRADES 6, 7, 8 & 9]

Learn the art of verbal combat! Students will learn how to construct persuasive positions, defend against and attack each other's arguments, and cross-examine effectively. Students will debate various age- and experience-appropriate topics, form teams, and pit themselves against their peers. Debate topics may include school uniforms, private/public school, and school food. By the end of the course, students will be comfortable speaking at the podium and have a good idea of how to structure a thoughtful argument, how to refute a statement you disagree with, and how to get that last word in.

Intermediate Financial Market Trading [GRADES 7, 8, 9 & 10]

Prerequisite: Introduction to Financial Market Trading.
Class meets 1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m.

This course is a continuation of the Introduction to Financial Market Trading. We will introduce more advanced strategies with both the Forex Market and Stock Market. Students will learn various chart patterns. We will introduce the Cryptocurrency Market, as students will learn how to trade Bitcoin. Students will also learn the most valuable lessons, which are risk-to-reward ratio and money management. This class will be using back-tested data to demonstrate trading strategies. This is a course that the students can go home and practice 24-hours a day, six days of the week.

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ENRICHMENT COURSES (Enrichment Courses meet from 9:00 a.m. – 9:50 a.m.)

Intro to Financial Market Trading

[GRADES 7, 8, 9 & 10]

This course will examine the financial markets, particularly the FOREX market, on how financial traders create wealth trading using the FOREX Market. Students will begin by learning technical analysis, trend, Fibonacci Sequences, resistance, gaps, support, and supply and demand. They will learn how the news affects the markets as well. Students will be using a demo account and will be making live trades in the class. Students will understand how to use Japanese candlesticks in the demo account and determine if there is a bull or bear market. In addition, students will learn financial terminology. Students will also learn the most valuable lessons, which are risk-to-reward ratio and money management.

to present both impromptu and prepared speeches on topics of their choosing. Speeches include biographical introductions and informative "how" explanations. Students will also become familiar with strong public speaking basics by viewing and critiquing famous speeches, old and current.

World of Web Design

[GRADES 8, 9 & 10]

The world of software design is booming! In this beginning course, students will cover the software creation process. Students will learn the object of oriented design principles and programming fundamentals as they plan their projects. Java will be the primary language to teach and understand data types and methods. Students will work individually and in small groups to explore new concepts. No previous programming experience is required.

Public Speaking

[GRADES 7, 8, 9 & 10]

Students will learn to express themselves with greater confidence and clarity in a fun summer environment in this class. The course is designed to help develop critical-thinking skills. Students will have the opportunity

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ACADEMIC COURSES (Meet from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. or 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.)

English Essentials I [GRADES 6 & 7]

English Essentials I is designed to enhance fundamental reading and writing skills through the close reading of short stories and poetry. Students will complete text-based grammar exercises. The writing workshop will focus on the body paragraph as the basic unit of the analytical essay. While grammar, reading, and composition remain at the heart of the course, students will also learn to develop original arguments based on their interpretive discoveries.

English Essentials II [GRADES 8, 9 & 10]

This course reviews the fundamentals of reading, composition, and grammar basics. Whereas English Essentials I focuses on fundamental writing concepts, this class focuses on the multi-paragraph analytical essay. All writing assignments will encourage students to develop their critical reading skills while close-reading short stories and poetry. Students will be encouraged to formulate original arguments based on their own interpretive discoveries.

Pre-Algebra [GRADES 6 & 7]

This course will review and complete the study of whole numbers, decimals, and fractions. Concepts of algebra, discrete mathematics, functions and patterns, geometry, logic, numbers, probability and statistics are included. Attention is given to manipulate proportional relationships, multiple representations, patterns and generalizations, real-world applications, and problem-solving strategies.

Readiness for Algebra I [GRADES 7, 8 & 9]

This course is designed for anyone getting ready to enter an algebra course. Students will work on big ideas of algebraic thinking that students can develop before they enter algebra. The ideas are Representation, Proportional Reasoning, Variable, Function, and Inductive/Deductive Reasoning. The concepts will be introduced through classroom activities, partner projects, such as poster creation and presentation. Students will also review and strengthen pre-algebra skills as they study the big ideas.

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ACADEMIC COURSES (Meet from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. or 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.)

Readiness for Algebra II [GRADES 9, 10 & 11]

This course will review the Algebra I skills essential to one's success in subsequent mathematics courses. Topics will include: The Real Number System and its properties, Solving Linear Equations, Solving Multi-step and Compound Linear Inequalities, Solving Quadratic Equations by Factoring, Solving Systems of Equations, Laws of Exponents, Monomial and Polynomial Expressions, Rational Expressions, Intro to Functions, Graphing Problem Solving Approaches, and Numeracy.

Readiness for Geometry [GRADES 8, 9 & 10]

This class covers almost a full year of high school geometry. Students will concentrate on the study of Euclidean Geometry while maintaining and enhancing algebraic skills. Students will learn the ideas, concepts, and theorems of this branch of mathematics as the early mathematicians developed them. Students will also extend their reasoning skills by forming geometric arguments and applying these principles to solve problems in various situations.

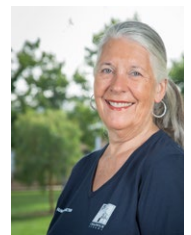

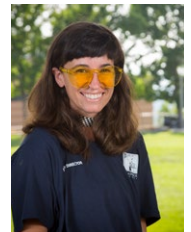

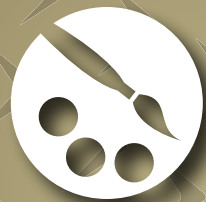

AU Weekly

[AGES 11-15]

If students like to write, interview, and take pictures, this is the class for them. Budding journalists get hands-on experience as the news crew that publishes a digital Arts Unlimited newspaper.

Cartooning

[AGES 11-15]

Create your own character! Structure, facial expressions, basic cartoon anatomy, and character personalities will be taught to help form your character(s). Simple single shape characters to 5-head high characters, anthropomorphic animals, objects, environments, and composition will be taught to help you create a comic strip using the character(s) you design.

Chess

[AGES 11-15]

Stretch that brain! In this instruction class, students will learn this game of strategy or advance their expertise. All levels welcomed and challenged.

Creative Writing

[AGES 11-15]

For the writer in you. This class will feature techniques and mechanics for creative writing. Poetry will be presented for those who desire to explore this genre. Students will do writing "warm ups", construct stories, and keep journals of their work.

Cross Stitch

[AGES 11-15]

Dance

Get moving! Learn a variety of styles of dance to strengthen your body, move, and have fun. Learn techniques and choreography all while having a blast. All levels welcome.

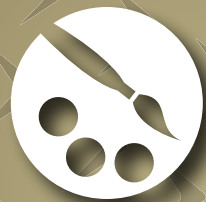


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Digital Film

[AGES 11-15]

Have you ever wanted to make a movie? Here is your chance to learn the art of cinematic storytelling through the basics of story board development, scriptwriting, directing, cinematography, and editing. Each student will end the course with a copy of their own personal film. Students must provide their own equipment (iPhone or iPad).

Drawing

[AGES 11-15]

Drawing is more than pencil marks on paper. Explore drawing possibilities with markers, colored pencils, pastels, and whatever else you find exciting. We will help you get your ideas onto paper. Have fun, experiment with new ideas and techniques, and fall in love with drawing.

Fiber Arts

[AGES 11-15]

In this class we'll have fun creating works of art using fiber materials. Explore the peaceful and satisfying art of weaving and embroidery while working with natural fibers and fabrics. Create wall hangings, wearable art and even functional art for your home.

Improv

[AGES 11-15]

Theater games, sketch writing, performance, and characterization are part of the fun of improv and comedy. Students learn the art of theatrical expression and the acting tools used to achieve it in this workshop class. Students will become familiar with developing characters, structuring stories, and having fun in the context of improvisational games and scene-based activities.

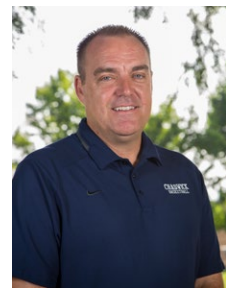

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Summer Program General Information

Enrollment

To enroll in any program, please visit our website at www.chadwickschool.org/summer, where you can complete registration as well as submit payment. A separate registration must be completed for each student enrolled. The balance of the tuition and fees are due at the time of registration. There is no enrollment deadline; however, enrollment is limited in all programs and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Programs and courses have a minimum and maximum enrollment. Chadwick School reserves the right to cancel any class that does not have adequate enrollment. We will hold a waitlist based on the time that a registration was received.

Refund Policy

Full tuition can be refunded for any withdrawal made before May 31st, 2021. No refunds will be made for a withdrawal after May 31st, unless there is a waiting list for that program and the withdrawing student's place can be filled. No refunds will be made after the first day of classes.

Please be aware that in the event of a school or cohort shutdown, students will be expected to continue their coursework virtually and will resume in-person when it is safe to do so. **No refunds or partial reimbursements will be made should students have to study from home in this scenario.**

Conduct

All students are expected to behave responsibly and with respect for others and for the campus in general. The usual rules of safety, order, and cooperation are enforced. Students will be reminded of the core values of Chadwick School and are expected to understand and abide by the values of our school, whether virtually or in-person. Specific rules and procedures will be reviewed with each child at the start of summer session. Students who fail to abide by summer program policies will be dismissed. Students who are dismissed for disciplinary reasons will forfeit tuition.

Dining Program

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, there will be no campus dining program this summer. In-person students will need to bring a snack and their own packed lunch each day of camp. If it is safe to do so, we will be offering a pizza party during summer camp. We will provide information about this event as it approaches.

Extended Day Care Mornings and Afternoons

Due to cohort restrictions and LA County Guidelines, we are unable to offer morning and aftercare this summer. Students will need to be dropped off for camp between 8:45 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. for the start of summer programs. Students will need to be picked up promptly at 3:00 p.m. each day of camp. We will not be able to offer extended care this year prior to or following the regular camp times.

Bus Service

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we are unable to run bus service this summer for in-person programming.

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Frequently Asked Questions

When do Chadwick Summer Programs run?

Chadwick Summer Programs 2021 will run for 5 weeks, from Monday, June 21st until Friday, July 23rd at 12:00 noon. Our academic programs will be run with stable in-person cohorts (space limited) as well as virtually with our online distance learning model. Most classes will have class size limits and a waitlist.

How old do you have to be to sign up for a class?

On the course description page you will find the age or grade level that is appropriate for each program or class. For some academic offerings, students will be evaluated early in the program to assess if they are in the right course and can easily be moved to the proper course.

I love the ability to change classes and pick courses for my child. Is this possible with your in-person summer program?

Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions, we are unable to provide a wide variety of choices this summer. Students need to remain in a stable cohort throughout the day and are unable to change specific classes once the programs begin.

Can I only take one class, or pick and choose?

Due to COVID-19, our in-person offerings are limited to full-day students only, following a daily schedule with their specific cohort. This is done so that we can safely

provide stable cohorting for each program and group. Virtual online offerings are available a la carte, so feel free to mix and match to your child's interest!

How do I sign up for classes?

Registration for our in-person and virtual class options will be open to the general public at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, April 19th. You can sign up at: www.chadwickschool.org/summer

What has Chadwick implemented to keep our children safe from virus spread?

Chadwick follows safety guidelines based on the LA County Department of Health Guidelines. All in-person students are required to pass a temperature check upon arrival. Families need to fill out a short survey each morning in SchoolPass that lets our team know if there has been contact or symptoms. In-person students will move together in stable cohorts with two adults throughout their school day. Students are required to wear masks and maintain a social distance of 6-feet. Students will be asked to wash their hands regularly. Students will eat lunch at outdoor tables under social distancing guidelines. Our campus will be cleaned and sanitized throughout the day and in the evenings. Materials will be sanitized as necessary based on exposure and use.

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What will happen if someone contracts COVID-19 during Summer Programs?

Should a student, staff, or faculty member contract COVID-19 during Summer Programs, we will be in contact with any who may have been exposed. This will likely prompt the closure of the cohort involved, and those students would have to quarantine for 10 days per the current LA County guidelines. Our safety and risk management team will continue to monitor any such contamination to the campus and will follow the protocol and guidelines that the county has specified. Please note that the school will not give partial refunds or reimbursements for programs that are shut down. The cohorts will continue to run their learning virtually should this occur.

What is the proper appearance online and behavior protocol?

We expect all students to follow the core values of Chadwick School (Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Compassion, Honesty) when working in-person and remotely in our programs. Students will need to dress appropriately (no pajamas!) during course instruction based on the requirements of that class. In-person students should dress appropriately and comfortably for the summer program.
