

SCHOLARSHIP POLICY OF QSI INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL OF SHENYANG

Established by the Advisory Board on
May 8, 2015 (amended May 2017)

1. Scholarships are dedicated to foreign families with school-aged children in need of financial assistance. This may include families whose employer will only partially cover tuition costs, if the family can demonstrate the need for financial assistance.
2. Each school year the school will enroll scholarship students such that they represent no more than 10% of the school enrollment from 5 year olds to 18 years old.
3. The decision to exempt a particular child from payment of the Capital Fund Fee will be made by the school's Advisory Board. The criteria to determine whether or not a child will be granted a scholarship may include the following:
 - a. Parents must complete an application form, which includes financial information and any other supporting document requested by the advisory board.
 - b. Preference is given to students who are already enrolled in the school and students who already have a scholarship so as to enable them to continue in the program.
 - c. The child must be in excellent health and may be required to pass a physical examination.
 - d. Previous school records may be reviewed in the process.
 - e. Particular ages may be targeted for scholarships to help build up that age group.
4. If approved by the Advisory Board, the family will receive a percentage discount generally no more than 15%.
5. In the event of serious disciplinary problems or in the event it becomes evident that the student is not taking advantage of the educational opportunities offered in the school, the Director of the school may recommend to the Advisory Board that the enrollment of the student be terminated. In this case the Advisory Board has authority to revoke the scholarship. The student may re-enroll as a full-fee paying student at the Director's discretion.
6. The exemption will be reviewed yearly with respect to financial need, academic achievement, leadership, and social growth. In addition, it is expected parents or guardians will make contributions to the school through school involvement.
