Emergency Drill Practice Day

The safety and security of our students and your children is of utmost importance to the school. For this reason, it is importance for us to practice and communicate regularly any safety concerns and procedures at KIS. Regular safety drills are part of our general safety and security plan that will be practiced throughout the year. Please see in the below documents some important information concerning these safety drills and other general information.

Thursday, September 19th

Please see the safety and security actions below that KIS follows. Next Thursday, the school will practice, Bus Evacuations, Bomb Sweep, Lockdown and Fire Evacuation.



Lockout is followed by the Directive: "Secure the Perimeter" and is the protocol used to safeguard students and staff within the building.



Lockdown is followed by "Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" and is the protocol used to secure individual rooms and keep students quiet and in place



Evacuate is always followed by a location, and is used to move students and staff from one location to a different location in or out of the building.



Shelter is often a response to poor weather preventing the school from dismissing, but may also include a response to any natural disasters or civil unrest.



Bomb Threat Sweep is used to check the building for any suspicious items, if a bomb threat has been made.



Bus Evacuation is practiced in case of an accident or emergency situation in which students need to exit the bus.

SMS Test Run & Kozak Connect Platforms

We will use our mass SMS system and Kozak Connect Platforms to practice school-to-parent communication on this day. A Message concerning the drills will be sent out.















Kyiv International School Transportation Service

KIS offers a transportation (bus) service to and from school. We operate with around 27 buses and run 2-3 late buses, following our after school activities. If you choose to use our bus service, please see the following information concerning bus safety and security.

Bus Monitors

All buses have a bus monitor who is responsible for the safety of each bus and is in contact with families. In case of any delays or route changes, the bus monitor will contact each family.

Late buses will now also have a bus monitor, but due to staffing difficulties, English is limited.

All buses have the following:



Seat Belts

All buses have seat belts which students are expeted to use at all times.



First Aid Kit

All buses have a first aid kit with basic medical supplies for emergencies.



Industrial Scissors

In order to cut a seat belt, if it is stuck in an emergency evacuation.



Window Hammer

In order to break a window, if needed to evacuate the bus.



Air Conditioning & Heating

Bus monitors are expected to report if these are not working at any time.



Evacuation Map

Each bus will have a separate evacuation map and plan posted.



- 1. RESPECT the driver and bus monitor. Please listen to and follow their intructions.
- 2. Remain seated and WEAR A SEAT BELT at all times. The bus will not drive unless all students are seated with a seat belt.
- 3. Use APPROPRIATE

 LANGUAGE and respect other
 people's space and property.
- 4. Keep the bus CLEAN.
- 5. Be ON TIME to the arranged pick up and drop off locations.

School Bus Evacuation Drills

School bus evacuation drills are completed with other school emergency drills. Students need to know how to properly vacate a school bus in the case of an emergency. These drills will be practiced in the morning when students exit the bus upon arrival at school.

Dear Parents,

During the weeks of Sept 16-Oct 12 your elementary child (6yo-10yo) will take a MAP® Growth™ test from NWEA® on a computer or tablet. KIS gives students MAP Growth tests to determine their instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year (and from year to year) in reading and mathematics. MAP Growth tests are unique in that they adapt to your child's level of learning. If your child answers a question correctly, the next question is more challenging. If they answer incorrectly, the next one is easier. This results in a detailed picture of what your child knows and is ready to learn—whether it is on, above, or below their grade level. Since MAP Growth tests provide immediate and accurate information about your child's learning, it's easy for teachers to identify students with similar scores that are generally ready for instruction in similar skills and topics, and then plan instruction accordingly.MAP Growth reports also provide typical growth data for students who are in the same grade, subject, and have the same starting performance level. Following each testing period, you will receive a report showing your child's growth, which you can review with your child's teacher for more insight. We are truly excited to focus on your child's individual growth and achievement.

MAKING CONNECTIONS BETWEEN STUDENTS YOUNG AND OLD!


Mr. Byers' IB Theory of Knowledge Year I cohort visited Mrs. Legan's Kindergarten class for their first project of the year.

As one of the first projects for this class, the students prepared a series of short "knowledge experiments" and asked the Kindergarten students a series of questions. The goal was for the IB students to investigate what little kids know and where that knowledge comes from.

Dear KIS Community,

I would like to thank everyone who registered their child for our after-school programs. CEESA trips, drama productions and after school activities and sports are extraordinary experiences for our students. They are events that help students learn and grow and have fun! I strongly encourage every student at KIS to get involved in our Kozak Nation.

Our after-school programs run independently – they are not covered by your tuition fees. Therefore, there are extra costs associated with the after-school sports and activities. For all sports, there will be a league fee. This fee covers buses when teams go to other destinations in Kyiv, tournament and race fees, referees and uniform costs.

All CEESA costs are paid for by the students who travel. Oksana Law (Assistant AD/AC) and I work hard to purchase inexpensive tickets – to do this, we need to have deposits and copies of students' passports, as well as the signed permission slips. Buying tickets for groups, is not the same as buying a single ticket – airlines will often have a few cheap tickets, but not enough for the whole group. While you may be able to find a cheap flight on the internet, it is usually not possible to buy that cheap ticket for a whole team. The final CEESA cost includes the coaches' flights, the coaches' hotel and a per diem for coaches, as well as the students' airfare. We ask for a USD 400 deposit. If the cost of the trip is less expensive, the remainder will be refunded. We will continue to strive to buy tickets early, so that we can get the lowest price.

Living with other families from other cultures offers a wealth of knowledge, but also comes with high expectations, as our Kozaks represent KIS. There are clear expectations for the students who travel, and they will be asked to agree to these responsibilities before they travel.

Do you kayak, rock climb, grow food or animals, build rockets or bridges, save lives or the environment, serve your country or community in your professional life or just like to guide girls in learning about our world and becoming responsible global citizens? Your gift of a few hours with girls is invaluable!

How do your daughter and you get involved?
