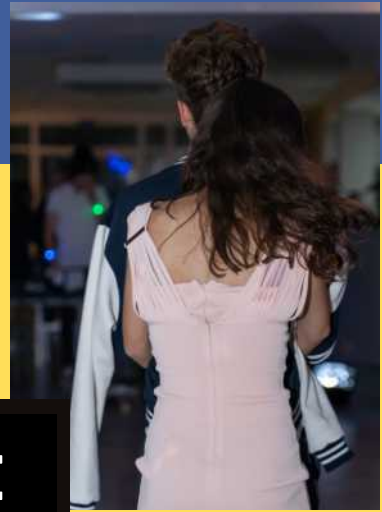
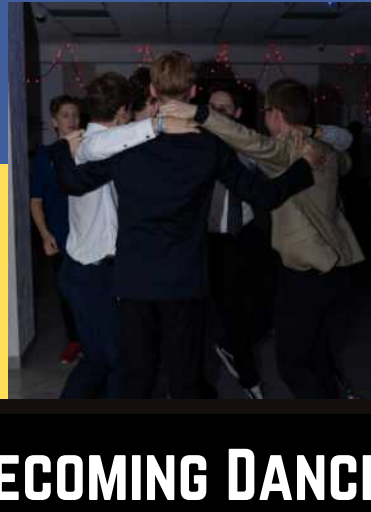

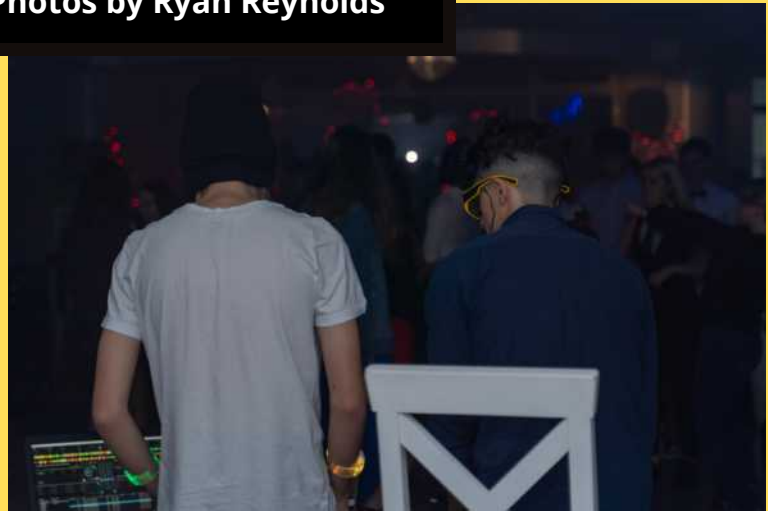

Under the Eco-Schools umbrella, the existing Environmental and Service Initiative will take environmental action forward.

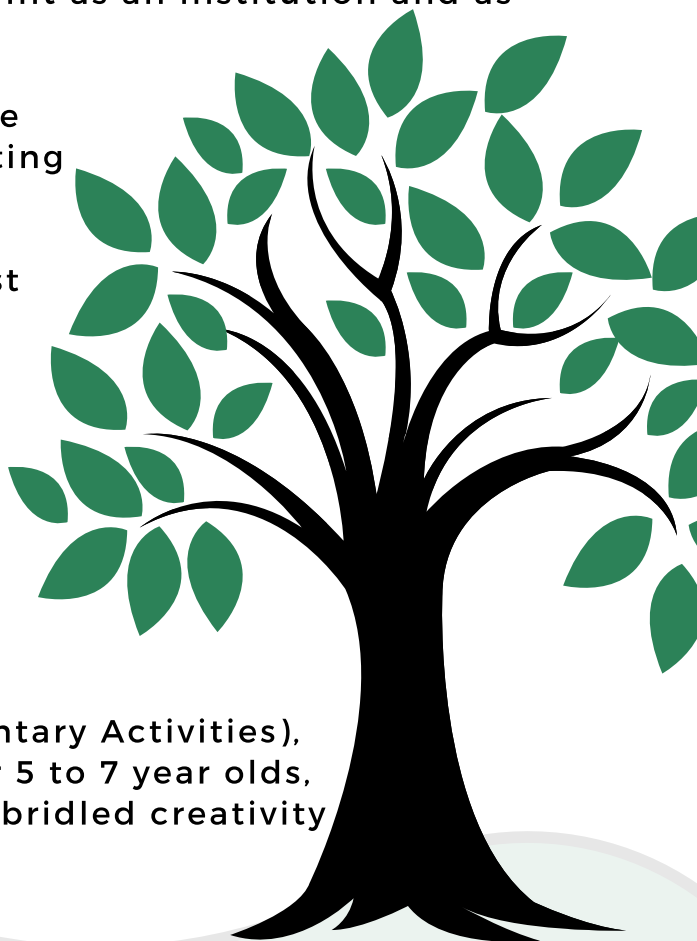
Eco Committee

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUCCESS ORIENTATION CELEBRATION

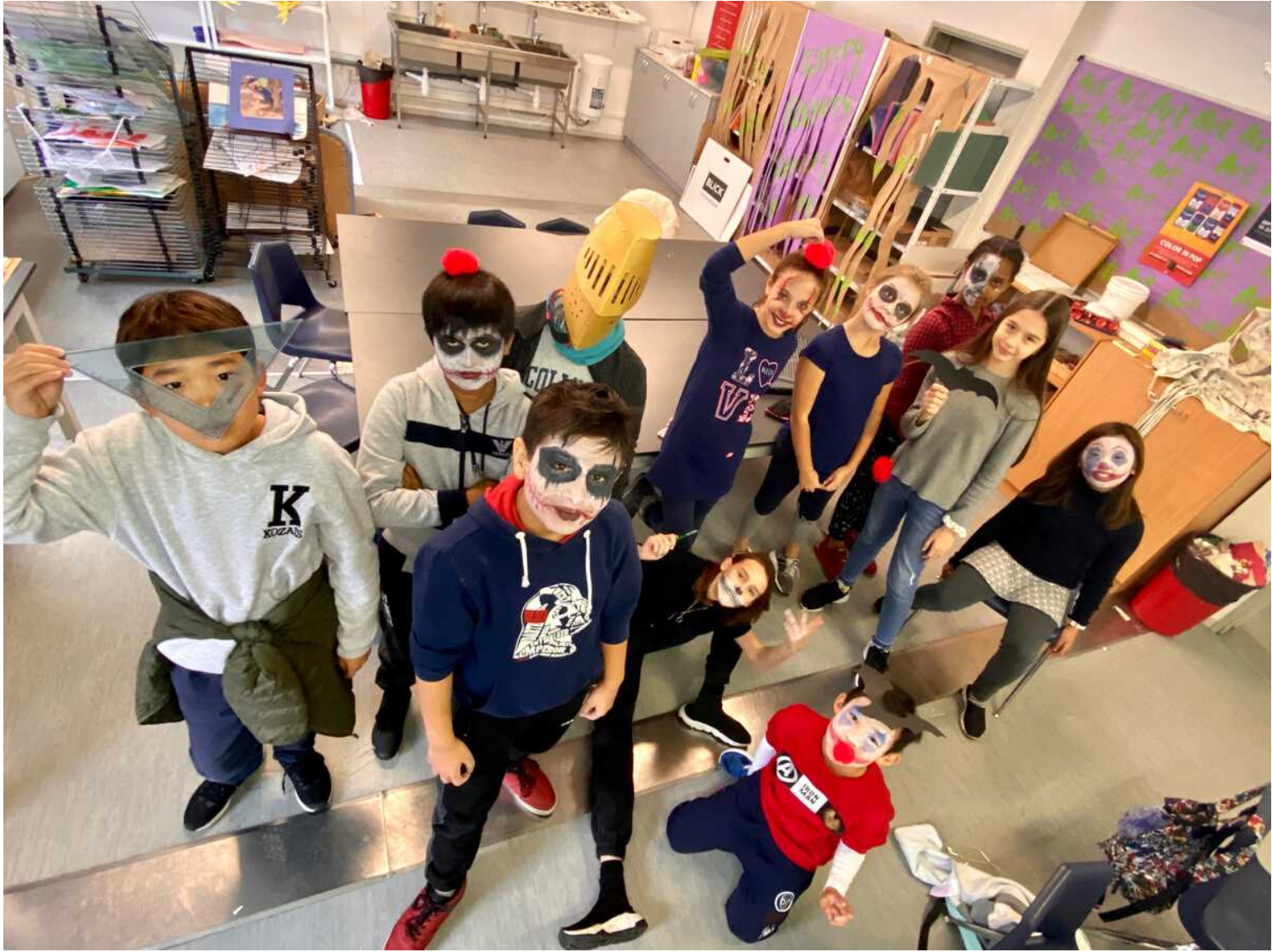

POE'S FILM FESTIVAL

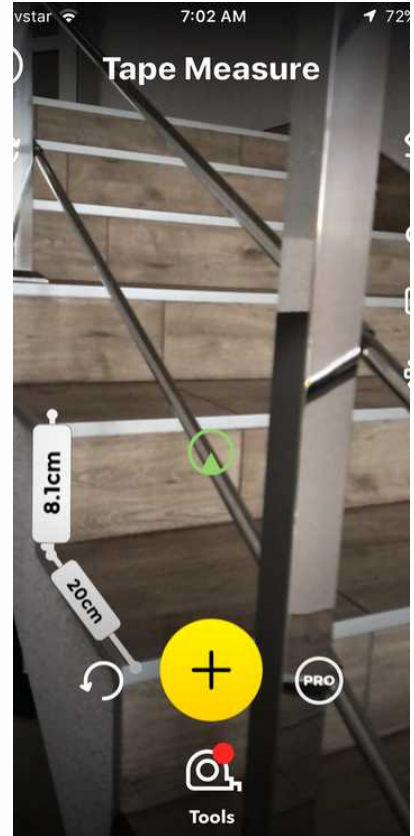

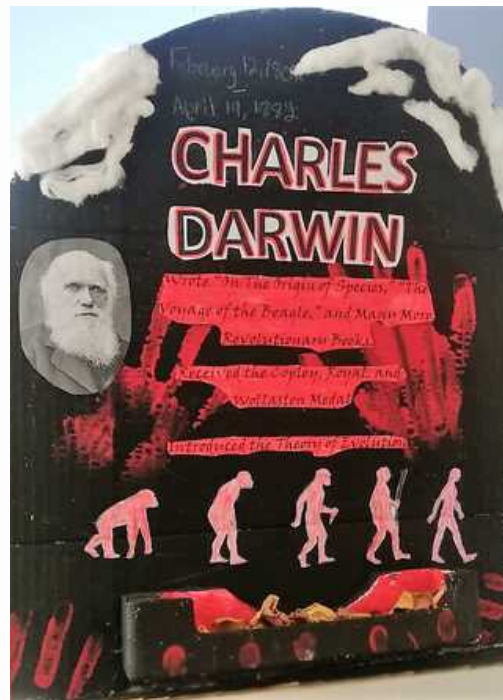
Since the silent movie era, filmmakers have made and remade movies of Poe’s macabre tales. The students worked in groups to organize a **Poe Film Festival**.

The students chose clips from the old and modern films and provided an introduction to each of the selections that gave some background and prepared the viewers for what they were to see. The students compared and contrasted the films, commenting on directors’ interpretations of Poe’s stories. The results of their research were organized in a presentation and a poster.

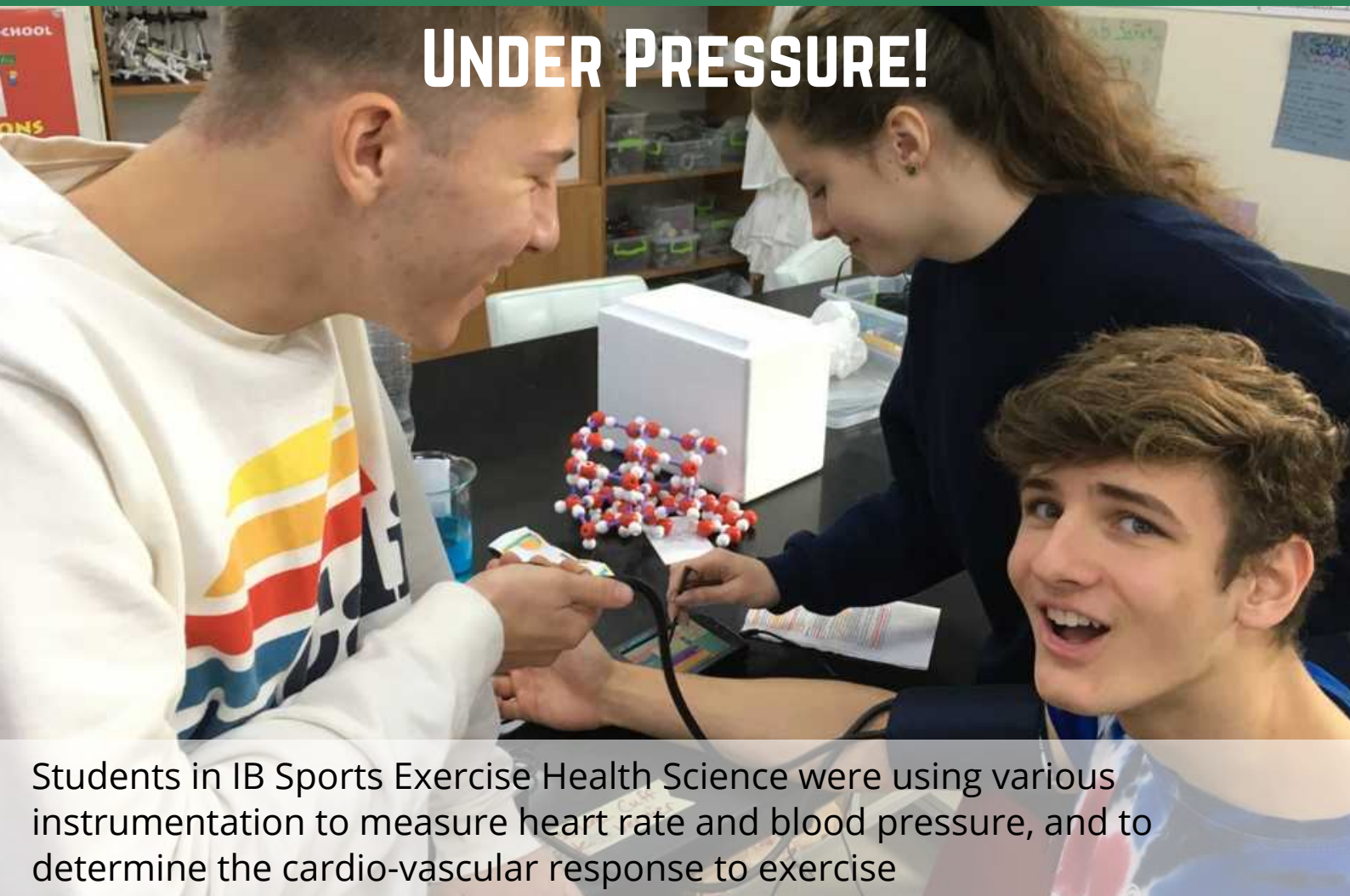
The Stair Case of Doom

Dr. Sunitha's Biology class students are taking Halloween pretty seriously. Have you walked up their staircase recently?

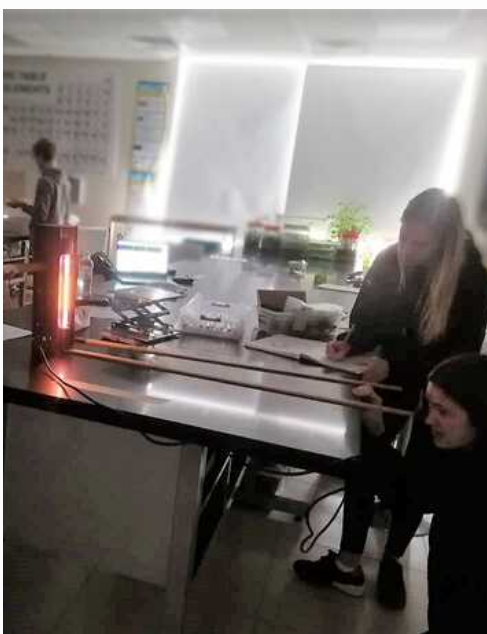
The stairs are filled with tombstones of famous Biologists, and Scientists who have contributed to the overall growth and knowledge of the biology subject.

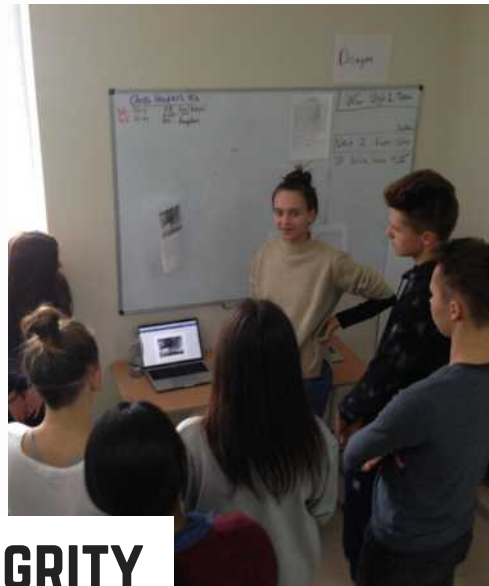
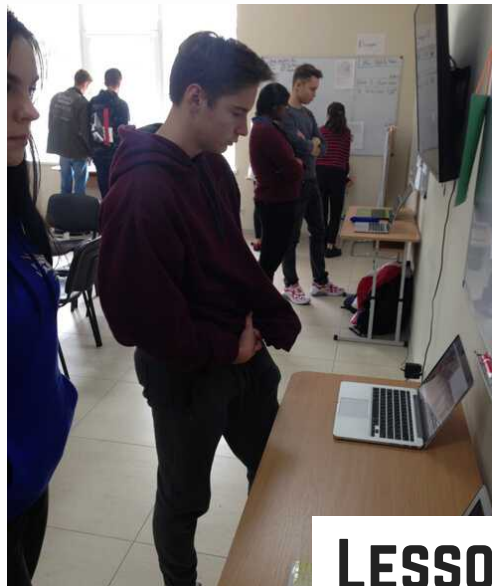


Students in IB Sports Exercise Health Science were using various instrumentation to measure heart rate and blood pressure, and to determine the cardio-vascular response to exercise



JUMPING ELECTRONS

IB and AP chemistry students are at it again. In this engaging hands-on lab students learned about atomic energy levels, atomic emission spectroscopy, and the spectral "fingerprints" of elements. Students were able to capture spectra, calculate wavelength and energy emitted from different gas emission tubes. It is an interactive and fun way to reiterate curriculum concepts.



LESSON ON ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

The internet has provided students with a wealth of information and knowledge but has also increased the percentage of plagiarism in high schools. In an effort to help students understand this concept, students took on the role of the victim rather than the thief.

The outcome of this lesson, which was modified from Deborah Zarka Miller, an Assistant Professor of English at Anderson University, was inspiring.

IB TOK students were tasked to create an original work of art that articulates a specific emotion.

Students were learning how to analyze art for mood and emotion but they had yet to create their own art. Mr. Byers, the TOK teacher encouraged students to invest some time in their creations. "Have fun with this project," he stated "Try to impress me and your peers with your creativity."

Students were given a full week to create something impressive. During the presentations, students completed a gallery walk and then had 60 seconds to present and reflect on their creations.

Some of their projects were trite and obviously done last minute but most of the projects were excellent. After all the presentations had been completed, students were then free to "claim" any of the projects in the room. They were told that more than one person could choose the same project and that not all of the needed to be selected. Students selected the projects they liked the most.

Here is what happened next. Students who did not invest that much time or energy in to the project, selected projects that were top quality and most creative. Students who invested time in their project walked around until they found a project (other than their own) that they liked enough to "claim" as creative and admirable.

Next came the shocking new, students were instructed to "Cross out the name of the person who created that project and write their own name in its place. When graded credit will be given to the student who claimed the work, not to the student who created it."

At firsts students thought this was joke, but then it got ugly. Students looked at one another for confirmation that what they heard was correct. Then a few students were openly angry, stating that giving someone else credit for the work they had done was wrong. Several others said, "If I had known you were going to let someone else steal my work, I would not have wasted my time completing the assignment in the first place!"

And of course, some students were happy, the students who did not put effort in to produce something impressive. But, of these students, most stated that they felt guilty, "stealing" the work from their friends and peers.

Eventually, the students picked on the idea that this lesson was bigger than just creating a project on emotions. They were quick to realize that this was an example of plagiarism but viewed from a different angle.

Although, I doubt this lesson changed anyone's life, I am hopeful that the students understand the decisions they make when gathering information and finding ideas from published sources. The injustice they felt during this lesson leads to more than just a discussion on plagiarism, it discuss the idea of academic integrity and this something we can always find time to discuss.

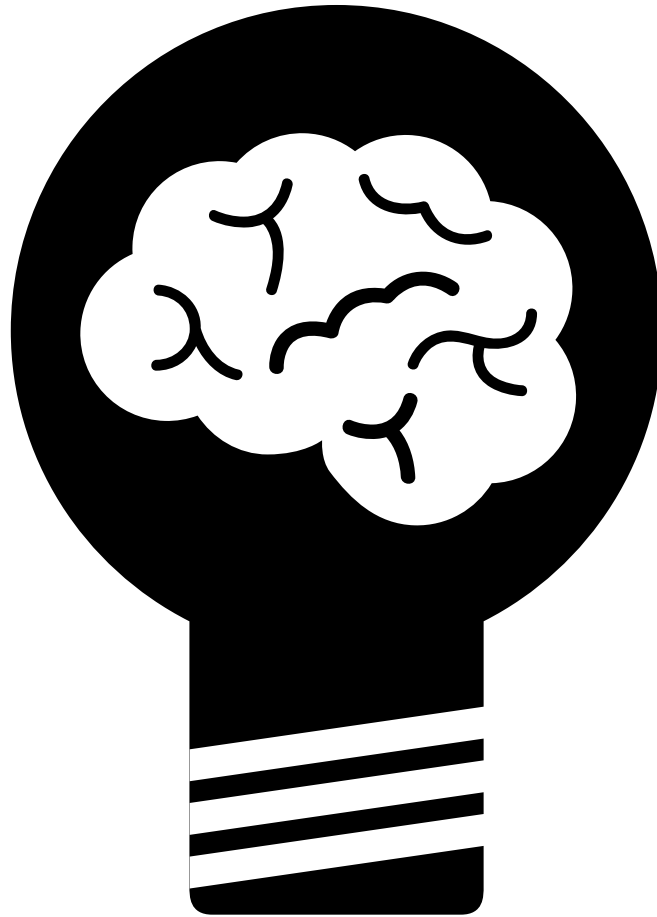

Stay warm and we hope your heating has been turned on!

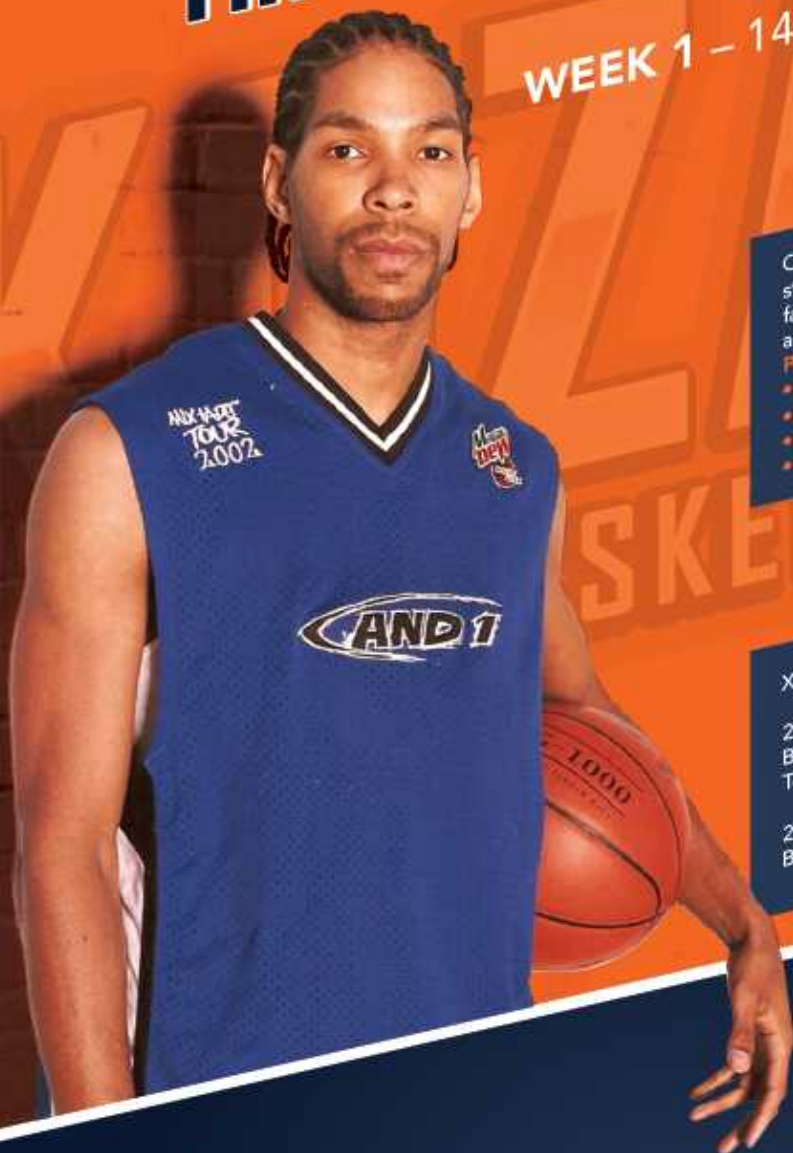
