





# **Teacher Professional Development: Making Thinking Visible**

As you know, teachers have spent Thursday and Friday working together as professionals and learners.

This year, the school has continued with the focus of making thinking visible and how we are working with purpose to build a thinking culture at our school. Mark Church, one of the co-authors of "Making Thinking Visible" has been with us again the past three days leading the discussion.

Curiosity is a spark that leads to learning and development.

The concept of a growth mindset emphasizes the importance of recognizing, praising, or celebrating one's effort rather than intelligence. This helps children to begin focusing on the value of effort over product. The same is true of curiosity and how it relates to the product of thinking. What is the impact on a child as we begin to highlight, praise, and celebrate their curiosity? Taking the time to ask questions, talk about issues, and discuss opinions can create a culture of thinking at school and at home. This can help to stimulate curiosity and eagerness to think/learn.

The news, movies, books, music, art, and the day-to-day activities of our lives provide us with many opportunities for discussion and conversation. Working against us are the many distractions that exist and pull us away from being connected in this way (phones, iPads, video games, social media, etc.).

These past couple days have been a reminder to me of the need for these things to be intentional at school and at home with my own family:

Where do I see curiosity each day, and how is it being valued?

What are the opportunities presented to highlight curiosity and extend the dialogue of thinking?

Since thinking is foundational to learning and growth, it makes so much sense that we should be looking into better ways to understand, teach, value, and promote good thinking.














# **AROUND THE WORLD WITH MRS. GRAFF**

# APPLYING WHAT YOU KNOW IN 8L

## **ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES**



Two middle school robotics teams from KIS traveled to Budapest last week to take part in the CEESA MS Robotics competition.

The K- Bots 1 team included: Iosif, Ami, Lev, Mor, and Sergey; the K-Bots 2 team included: Maleah. Marton. Max. Sam. and Xander.

The competition was hosted by the American International School of Budapest.

After two and a half months of persistent work, the teams were ready to show what they could do. Twenty teams from Hungary, Ukraine, Latvia, Poland, Russia, Albania, Romania, Bulgaria, and Austria participated in the competition.

The first day was a round-robin format. Each team played in 6 matches.

At the end of the round robin,  $K-Bots\ 2$  finished with the high score of 295 and in first place.

K-Bots 1 was seeded 8th with the high score of 255.

#### **ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES**

The next day, teams played head-to-head matches in a double-elimination format. Both our teams played very well and won their until they had to play each other face-to-face.



That was a very dramatic match. The teams finished with only a 10-point difference 280:270. K-Bots 2



K-Bots 1 still had a chance to get to the finals, but technical issues with their robot caused a loss at the next match. The team showed great teamwork and didn't give up until the end.




Meanwhile, K-Bots 2 were still undefeated and headed to the final match. The semi-final match against Bob The Builders (Vienna) resulted in 245:255 for K-Bots 2. In the final match, our team played against the Epic Penguins from Moscow. The tension was felt around the arena. The 150-second match was filled with uproar and excitement. 3...2...1. The match was over. Final score 310:270. Our K-Bots 2 won AND achieved the highest score of the competition!









