DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

LOOKING FORWARD TO A NEW DECADE

Happy New Year! I want to wish you all a wonderful 2020. It has been interesting to look back at the past decade and think of the many amazing things that have happened around the world, here in Ukraine, and also at KIS. Generally, a new year is always exciting to me, as the reflective component produces an "it's a new year, and it's going to be a new me" mentality. This year, however, a few things of importance have stood out. Instead of writing a giant article talking about all of them, I am splitting this article into 4 different parts that look at 4 different mindsets.

Mindset #1: Stress Mindset

Stress seems to be a major topic in the world...maybe it always has been, but more and more the conversation has been moving towards more systematic change. Perhaps you have been reading more articles concerning shorter work weeks, the value of holiday time, more mental health support, and gyms seem to be popping up everywhere.

Last school year, at KIS, we changed our Middle School and Secondary schedules and added the Kozak 30 time in an effort to try and change our students' day to be less hectic and reduce stress. This school year we added a Health and Wellness policy for staff that promoted taking some time in the day to exercise, destress, as well as an email policy that reduced evening and weekend work emails. Beyond some of these systematic changes, there may be value in changing our mindset when it comes to how we view stress. Kelly Mcgonigal, a Standford psychologist, discusses how stress is our body's way of helping us grow and that some of these feelings are pushing us towards building relationships and seeking out support from those who care about us.

Welcome back, and I hope 2020 brings us all sorts of wonderful stresses and fantastic failures that help us grow and become better.

SCHOOL SECURITY

Kyiv International School strives to provide your children with a safe and positive educational environment at all times. Our facilities are meant to be for students, staff, and parents to build school community and promote student and community activities. In alignment with the school's Child Protection Policies and Procedures, CEESA guidelines, and updated Middle States Accreditation requirements, KIS would like to inform everyone of the following campus safety and security regulations:

ENTRANCE TO KYIV INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

Essentially, we always want to know WHO is on campus and WHY. KIS Security will open the inner door for those who have the appropriate ID or have checked in. This door is and should be locked at all times.



CAR ACCESS STICKERS

For cars to access the territory in the morning for drop off and pick up, you must have a parking sticker for the current school year. These stickers are available at reception. Security will only be allowing cars with these stickers onto the campus.



SCHOOL ID - WEAR THIS AT ALL TIMES

All adults planning to be on campus must have an ID or Visitor's Badge. If you do not have one already, please arrange to register for one from reception, and wear it at all times while at the school. The school must know who is on our campus and why at all times. KIS Security has been asked to have those without an ID badge to go through the check-in process.



CHECK-IN AT GUARD STATION (VISITOR'S BADGE)

Those who do not have a school ID or are visiting the campus will need to check-in at the guard station and get a visitor's badge. These need to be returned once an individual leaves the campus. There is a visitor's agreement on the back of every badge explaining some guidelines while on campus.

After School and Weekends

There are many activities going on at KIS, in the evenings and on the weekend. The entrance procedures are the same. Those who are not parents at KIS will need to check in at the guard station and receive a visitor's badge.



Student ID Cards

High School and Middle School students will be issued Student ID cards in order to access the campus on the weekends. Any groups planning to use facilities must coordinate this with a staff supervisor.

Easy Way to Show & Go!

It can be difficult to keep track of your ID card and just in case you leave it at home. Take a picture of it and always have it on your phone. This way you can easily Show it to security. We will be asking our middle school and secondary students to always have a picture of their ID on their phone.



Closed Campus

Kyiv International School is a closed campus. Once on campus, students are not permitted to leave the campus without parental permission and office approval before 3:35pm. Parents are asked to contact the divisional office managers if their child plans to leave school early. If a student feels unwell at school, the office staff will notify their parents and arrangements will be made to leave school. Students are not permitted to leave campus without prior parent written notification. Any students who leave campus will not be permitted to return on the same day without specific approval and permission.

Picking Up Students in the Middle of the Day

Parents and caregivers should go to reception to notify the school that they are picking up any student(s) and wait in the lobby while reception calls the teacher or department. School staff will escort the student to the lobby for pick up, if needed. An exit slip will be issued to show security when leaving early. In an effort of accountability, this helps the school to better know who is on and off campus at all times, each day.

Security Cameras

KIS has a video surveillance system on the campus, in order to safeguard its students, staff, parents, and others on campus. Video from the cameras are kept for 2–4 weeks. There are no cameras in private areas, such as bathrooms or changerooms, so we encourage all individuals to be extra careful with their belongings in these areas. If at any time, there may be a reason for the school to watch video from previous days, we ask you to consult school administration.

Video Recording in the Classroom

There are no cameras in any classrooms and students and parents are not permitted to take video of classrooms or lessons.

Theft and Missing Items

There are many people who access our campus throughout the day (students, staff, parents, drivers, nannies, teams from other schools, and other outside guests. For this reason it is extremely important to take care of your own personal items at all times. Most of the time, when an item goes missing, it is later found by the individual. However, at times there have been items taken by someone. If you are concerned about a missing item, please contact school administration to help look for it or look at our video surveillance.

ELEMENTARY WINTER CONCERTS

The last couple of weeks before winter break was very busy for all Elementary classes' music students. WHY???? The entire Elementary had Winter Concerts and they were fabulous! 7 and 8-year olds started the Elementary music festival day with the program "Catch the Holiday Spirit". The audience was delighted as the student showed off their performing skills with dance, playing xylophones and recorders, singing and moving along with cheerful winter songs. 9 and 10-year olds continued the festivities by presenting their "Swinging Holiday" show. Pop, jazz and blues styles were all mixed up and performed by outstanding groups of singers and dancers. Students showed their skills on the recorder, ukulele, flute and saxophone. 6-year olds completed the Elementary music festival with their "Crazy New Year" concert. They demonstrated their talents to play on desk bells, rhythms sticks, maracas, and to sing and dance along with winter songs medley.

SCHOLAR DOLLAR

As you walk in the main entrance to KIS, above the doors you see the motto "Success For All." Our goal as teachers at KIS is to promote student success in every subject that we teach. The Eight-Year-Old Classes have worked together to create a program that promotes positive behavior in the classroom as well as a variety of additional important life skills.

The program is called Scholar Dollars. Students earn "points" by demonstrating their use of the Success Orientations in class. This can be anything from completing homework on time, to being kind and polite by helping someone in need. The points are collected over a number of weeks after which they are converted into Scholar Dollars. Three times a year, students can use these dollars to buy trinkets and toys from their classmates.

Just before the break we had our first sale. Students from 8B sold homemade cookies, handmade drawings and origami figures, salt dough Christmas ornaments, foods from their home countries, pencils, toys, etc. One student even sold "tickets" to use his drone for five minutes. All four classrooms were full of kids who had prepared hand-made items to sell to their friends. At the end of the day, their earnings were deposited into the Scholar Dollar Bank to be used at the next sale.

Not only does this activity promote positive behavior, it pairs well with our Math and Economics units. Students learned to be producers and consumers as they prepared and purchased their items. They thought through the "opportunity cost" of buying certain items instead of others. They practiced math skills as they made change for their peers.

The day ended with a floor full of excited students who had successfully demonstrated mastery of a variety of skills, while going home with bags of goodies.
