





10B Student of the Week. Everybody should have a moment in the spotlight!





CEESA HIGH (SECONDARY) KNOWLEDGE BOWL ISTANBUL INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SCHOOL, 6 FEB – 9 FEB

Two KIS Secondary Knowledge Bowl Teams traveled to Istanbul, Turkey for the CEESA competition. Team One consisted of three returning players - Ryan (team captain), Evan, Yersin Ordabay, and one first-time Knowledge Bowl participant, Maksym Stetskov.

Team Two consisted of four first-time Knowledge Bowl participants - Anastacia Reynolds (team captain), Maria Maksina, Maxim Sarciaux, and Zoltan Szepesi.

A 2-day Knowledge Bowl tournament consists of written rounds of multiple-choice questions followed by double-elimination head-to-head rounds. The challenge is to be able to think quickly under pressure. Questions must be answered within 10 seconds. Complex math questions allow 60 seconds to work through the problem and find the correct answer. Wow, an entire 60 seconds!!!

Team Two did not finish as well as they would have liked, but all were first-time Knowledge Bowl participants. They dealt quite effectively with the stress and intensity level of the tournament. I think all enjoyed the experience and made some new friends from other international schools.


Team One made it to the live-streamed final round and came away with a fantastic 4th place finish out of 14 teams. To make it to the final round, they beat a very strong team from Warsaw. Our team had their best round against Warsaw and also beat a team they had not beaten at CEESA last year or in the earlier head-to-head rounds at this year's CEESA. Talk about performing under pressure!!!

Team Captain Ryan Reynolds is graduating and his contributions and dedication to Knowledge Bowl will be missed. Ryan has left some big shoes to be filled for next year.

The coaches (Scott Carpenter and Darla Miller) were/are proud of our KIS Knowledge Bowl Teams and their ability to work through some challenging situations and by their ability to stay calm under the pressure of fast-paced competition.

The team was fortunate enough to have a late afternoon flight on Sunday and were able to visit the historic Sultanahmet area as a cultural experience. We found lots of cats and dogs to pet as well.
