Dear KIS Families,

The Ukrainian government recently made an announcement concerning the 5 different stage guidelines for the gradual reopening and easing of quarantine measures. At the same time, they also recommended that schools (part of stage 4) continue with online learning for the remainder of the school year. As of yesterday, they announced the extension of the quarantine to May 22nd, while moving into stage 1, on the 11th.

KIS administration, QSI headquarters, and the KIS Advisory Board have all agreed and made the difficult decision that KIS should keep the campus closed for the remainder of this school year and continue with our Online Learning Plan until our last scheduled school day (June 19th).

This was a very difficult decision, as we all would like to have our school campus open again, however, the health and safety of our students, staff, and our entire community is always our main priority. In the end, the recommendation from the government, current projections leading into May/June, considerations needed to feel confident opening our campus, and the desire to remove the uncertainty regarding whether we will return to the campus guided this decision. We hope that this decision will allow our students and teachers to focus on getting the most out of our online learning program, without some of the stress that has come with the unknown around this fluid situation.

Though our school campus will remain closed for all academic and activity purposes, we are considering how small groups of students may be able to interact in small groups with appropriate social distancing and safety precautions. This would be in the hope of providing some in-person closure to the school year, as we understand that families and friends often move on year-to-year within our international community.

A number of families/students have asked to come and retrieve their personal belongings. We understand that students have many things still on campus that will need to be collected before the end of the school year. In the coming weeks, we will make a plan for students to come and collect these items and return school resources.

We are currently looking at a unique ceremony to celebrate the graduating class of 2020.

KIS plans to open our campus for the 2020-21 school year on August 27th, as planned. In addition to our regular planning for this, we are discussing and planning for any adjustments and changes we may need to put in place in order to operate safely and open our doors again for our community. If your business or organization is planning or considering any safety measures that you feel would be applicable to KIS, please don't hesitate to contact us.

I would like to thank you for joining our morning Coffee Chats to discuss different questions and concerns. They have helped guide some of the information above, as they may be expressed by a few, but shared by others. Please feel free to complete the <u>KIS Parent Questions Form</u> to help us know of other questions you may have for us to consider.

I cannot say this enough, but on behalf of KIS and QSI, I would like to thank you all for your patience and understanding. We continue to look for ways that KIS can support our community, during this time. We also value the support and encouragement you have shared with us this past month.

Parents and students may refer to the document below for details about how learning is supported during a school closure.

Emphasis is on meeting the learning targets, not on a fixed amount of time on task, however, screen time is limited to 30 minutes to 1 hour for Early Years.

Videos(unless teacher made or short in duration for a teachable moment) will not be used during the face to face time with students.

The following are the guidelines for online learning in the KIS preschool: Face to Face meetings:

Mrs. Legan's Online Writer's Workshop




5L students have continued expressing their creative ideas and opinions during online writer's workshops. Creativity is an essential part of kids' intellectual and emotional development, and no one inspires young learners better than Mo Willems. The students love his characters, especially the silly character The Pigeon that puts a smile on their faces while we read these books. The students enjoyed reading "The Pigeon Has to Go to School!" and gave The Pigeon many reasons why he should go to school.

After reading "Don't Let The Pigeon Drive The Bus!", we learned how to draw a pigeon during our directed drawing lesson. Directed drawing lessons are a great way to encourage listening and following directions. Afterwards, we strengthen those little hands to improve fine motor skills and cut out our pigeons.

Mo Willem's books are great for introducing different concepts to the children. We were working on making connections, expressing opinions, and learning about speech bubbles. After reading "The Pigeon Wants a Puppy!" I asked kids: what do you think The Pigeon will want next and why? And what would you want if you were The Pigeon? The silly Pigeon is not shy to ask for some crazy wishes in the story. It could be anything, big or small. Is it a big pizza? A chance to walk on the moon? A basement, the same as grandpa has in Canada? Or is it something as simple as a cat, a rabbit or a toy? See for yourself what five year old children wish for.

STUDENT PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES DURING THE LOCKDOWN

The students in 10-D have been busy with many different projects during the COVID-19 lockdown. These projects have reached across most curriculum areas: science, literacy, mathematics, and technology. The students were given guidelines for each project, then they had to decide how to proceed. The students' creativity came out. The tech savvy students did lots with animation and video. Others used their musical gifts and writing talents. Many students had help from siblings and parents as well. The projects are described here by students who volunteered to write about our project-based learning activities.

Hydroponics Systems by Joshua

During the hydroponics activity, we had to design a garden which can grow seeds without soil, only water. I placed peas which are growing slowly. We also had to complete a handout with our observations, data collection, analysis, and conclusions. A variety of seeds were used: bean, carrot, basil, flowers, tomatoes, and many more. Each morning during science, students would, very proudly, share their projects and the growth being made. A few students had to redesign their hydroponics systems because they were not working well. In conclusion, we learned that hydroponics can be an alternative to soil based gardens.

Earth Day by Isabel

The class 10-D decided to celebrate Earth Day in a fun and unique way. Every student created their own Earth Day project. There were a lot of different and creative projects. Starting with animations, posters, and edits leading up all the way to composing music and writing songs! After two days of working on these projects, the class shared their projects with each other! We all enjoyed sharing and watching each other's projects!

Poetry Books by Tisha

A poem is a piece of literature in which the author puts the feelings and ideas in its poem by giving particular attention to the reader. Poetry is also known as verse, in which the poet uses sounds and images to express feelings and emotions. As you know there are many different kinds of poems, written by poets and kids. Some of the poems are sad, that will make you cry. Some are sweet, that will make you sing and swing.

My class and I learned many poems together, we also wrote poems and shared them with the class. Some of them were funny, others interesting, and it was hard to find titles for some poems. Finally, when all of the poems were word processed, everybody was feeling proud of their hard work that they had been doing for so long. Some of the poems had pictures on them and some of my classmates made pictures by themselves. After the pictures were colored, they looked very nice and creative.

Matter Evaluation Projects

Students in 10-D, were given guidelines (TSW) to develop some type of project sharing their knowledge and mastery of the material. These guides included the following questions: What is matter? What are the different forms of matter? What are the different states of matter? What are physical and chemical changes of matter? The students got creative with their projects. Some used animation, others made PowerPoint presentations, and some made videos. Once all the projects were completed, each student shared their project during the Zoom Science session.

The students will continue project-based learning in the 10-D classroom. The students work individually, collaboratively, and creatively. If you want to see some of our projects just ask one of us, and we will be happy to share them with you.



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AP exams begin next week and students at KIS have been working really hard to prepare. Please <u>see the exam schedule</u> to double check the day and time of the exam. Remember, students must convert these times to the time zone for Kyiv.



How Will Students Receive Exam Information?

- Two days before their exam, students will be emailed their exam ticket. If students do not receive this email, they should check their student account in My AP for their exam ticket.
- On May 4, students should have received an email from College Board with their AP ID and all the exams they have registered for.
 - If a student did not get this email, they need to check My AP in their College Board account to see the exams they are registered for.
 - If they see a problem with the exams they are registered for, they need to contact our AP Coordinator, Ms. Zoromski, immediately.

What Do Students Need To Do Before The Exam?

- Students should print and fill out the AP Exam Day Student Checklist. If students do not a have a printer, they should write the information on another piece of paper. They can also find the form here.
- Students should <u>watch this video</u> which has important exam information and explains how students will upload their answers.
 - This video shows students most AP exam upload information but AP Music Theory Exam, any AP Exam in a spoken world language, the performance tasks for AP Computer Science Principles, AP Research and AP Seminar, and any of the AP Art and Design portfolio assessments are structured differently.
 - See this information below
- Students should continue to review class information and look at supplemental videos on the **YouTube Channel** for Advanced Placement.
 - This week, Online AP Classes and Review Sessions will focus on the exam day experience and review new sample questions for all nonportfolio courses.
 - These sample questions are available on <u>each subject's course page.</u>
- Students should decide which device they want to use to complete their exam.
 - Students will be able to use a cell phone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer but they need to check their device to make sure it works. They can do this by completing the exam demo.
 - If they have a problem doing the exam demo on a device, they will not be able to use that device on exam day.
- Students should decide where they are going to test.
 - They should find a comfortable and quiet testing environment.
- Check College Board's AP Website daily.
 - Between now and their exam day, students should be looking for updates and completing steps needed before the exam.

What Do Students Do On Exam Day?

- Students should make sure their device is charged and that they have good internet connection in the place they are planning to test.
- Students will need to log into their exam at least 30 minutes before their exam begins in order to fill out exam and security information.
- Make sure they have their exam day documents. Not every exam has documents but some have important materials that need to be ready.

- Gather any supplemental items (such as calculators, formula sheets, etc)

What If Students Have A Problem On Exam Day?


- If a student accidentally closes the browser, their device crashes, or they temporarily lose internet access, they can quickly click their exam e-ticket again to return to the exam. They should continue the exam, and if they feel at the end of the exam that the temporary disruption negatively impacted their performance, they should contact their AP Coordinator.
 - They should not refresh the page or hit the back button on the browser.
- If students feel the disruption will impact their score, they need to contact our AP Coordinator, Ms. Zoromski, immediately so a make up test can be requested.
 - These must be submitted to College Board within 24 hours in order for students to be able to take the makeup exam.


SENIOR SPOTLIGHT
