DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear KIS community,

I can't believe we have reached our last week of school. It has been quite a year. As we approach the closing of this school year, I have been reflecting on these past few months and would like to take a moment to share some of the decisions that have been made by the school.

In February, we all watched the spread of COVID-19 with anticipation. I remember clearly our return from the February break, as the number of cases in Italy began to increase and KIS began to implement temperature checks. The first sign of how this would impact our community was when CEESA made the difficult decision to cancel all winter competitions.

On March 11, the Kyiv City Administration decided to close on-site learning for educational institutions and we were forced to close the KIS campus beginning from March 12th. We quickly implemented our online learning plan and shifted our program to a virtual learning environment. At this time, quarantine was introduced until April 24th, but as we watched the pandemic expand globally, we all expected this date to be extended.

I have been so impressed with the response of KIS staff and our community, as we worked together to implement online learning. It was not without its bumps and turbulence, and I fully understand that it required more involvement and support from parents. We all became quick experts on Zoom and made adjustments along the way.

It wasn't long before most schools began to close their doors and move to online learning. This began global meetings concerning online learning, including weekly CEESA administrator collaboratives to share perspectives, policies, and each school's status. It has been amazing to see how well all CEESA schools aligned in their response and approach to the pandemic.

At the end of March, we sent out a survey to the community to receive some feedback concerning the changing of our Spring Break and implementing some Catch Your Breath days. We knew that school was bringing some normalcy and consistency to a difficult situation.

At the beginning of May, Ukraine extended the quarantine to May 22nd and presented the different stages of reopening. They also recommended that schools close for the remainder of the school year. KIS, QSI, and the Advisory Board made the decision to continue with online learning, in order to remove uncertainty for students, parents, and teachers for the future and plan accordingly. Even though we have observed the restrictions ease in the city, KIS, QSI, and the Advisory Board did not feel prepared to push for students to return to school in any way. The safety of our students, teachers, and community is our highest priority and we want to feel ready to reopen.

I will be sending out a KIS Informer to everyone concerning our reopening guidelines on Monday and will be hosting a coffee chat for any parents who would like to discuss our plans for August.









5 YEAR OLD MUSIC CLASS






THE JOY OF READING AND WRITING IN KINDERGARTEN


























LOE PLACEMENT 2020-21

SUMMER SCHOOL



I have been asked to consult with the school community to determine if there is interest in attending a summer school this year. The developments relating to the Coronavirus Pandemic, social distancing, and quarantining of the public in Kyiv and Country of Ukraine, have created a very different, new, and sensitive set of circumstances that will likely impact the manner in which we will be able to run a summer school program.

It is clear that the distance learning delivery of education is a viable option and may have to be the approach for the summer school this year. Since the situation we are subjected to changes with little lead time, it may be the only manner to operate a summer school program for now.

While the at home education is an option, there is a possibility that the government may allow the opening up of schools with significant restrictions in place to safe guard the students, and staff involved. If this is the situation then we would need to know if you as a parent would be agreeable to these new conditions, where the school complies with government standards, and allow your son or daughter to participate in an on campus summer school. Our back up plan would be to continue the current distance learning. We may be able to introduce a hybrid of the two formats where students are allowed on campus in small groups to interact with teachers and then do the remainder of their work in consultation with their teachers at home. I need to know your preferences by the deadline for S.S. applications by checking the appropriate box on the registration form, and then sending the application form to the school on or before June 1st, 2020.

The school is working on developing an on-line registration form that can be filled in and sent to the school electronically. Please watch for additional advertisements, information in the KK, e-mail, or the other information circulars from the school.

Kyiv International School Summer School Application 2020

Kyiv International School's Summer Program is designed for those students who have not completed required units during the 2019-2020 school year. Participants will work with a qualified teacher to finish required assignments for unfinished units or will be expected to do all assigned work for a unit not yet begun. An end of the unit assessment is normally required to complete a unit and when a satisfactory grade is achieved the student will be awarded a passing grade of "B". Any units that a student would like to attempt to finish during summer school must be preapproved by the current teacher and the Director of Instruction, Mr. S. Legan, or Mr. J. Temple. Students who have completed less than 7 units in a subject are normally not allowed to attend summer school. Such courses are usually rescheduled in the next academic year. In extenuating circumstances, with the approval of a DI, a student may be allowed to attend SS with less that seven completed units. This decision will be made at the discretion of the individual DI's.

Week 1 June 22 – June 26 Week 2 June 29—July 3

The minimum registration fee is \$350 per week and students must prepay a \$60 non-refundable deposit along with this application. When work is satisfactorily completed and fees are paid grades will be posted on the school web site. Summer school registration will close on Wednesday, May 25 th, 2020.

When this application is received, summer school staff will begin collecting materials, books, teacher reports and unit information to optimize the summer school experience.

School rules are still in place during summer school and students found violating school rules will be removed from the program without refund.

Classes run from 9:00 am-3:00 pm each day and there will be no bus service. Students interested in lunch may order from local restaurants and have the food delivered to the school.

Summer School enrolment is being limited to 40 students per week to provide the optimum learning environment. Students will be accepted on a first come first served basis. The decision to limit enrolment is the responsibility of the Director of Instruction or the Summer School Administrator.
