Hello KIS community, this week we started our Fall 2020 MAP session with the needed precautions to comply with the safety measures adopted by our school **due to the** pandemic, for that your child will be testing using her/his own device at school.

The first group to be tested will be the 9 and 10 year olds, moving to the younger groups in the following days, also middle school will be starting on September 14th. The tests that your child will be taking are the Mathematics, Reading and Language Growth Tests; these tests are unique as they adapt to your child's level of learning.

There is no need to study for the MAP growth tests. However, it is important to make sure that your child is well rested on school days, and balanced breakfast is also a very important component, not only for the test but for every school day.

We are happy to announce that KIS library is opening its doors to our students.

With safety measures set in place, the school library is now ready for small groups of students to browse and check out books. Every student and staff member will be required to wear masks, keep the safe distance, and use disposable gloves when browsing the books. The gloves will be provided by the KIS Library.

Elementary school children will be coming to the library every other week according to their schedule, and have the opportunity to keep up to 8 books on their accounts depending on their age. Older students will be allowed to the library during other designated times during the day.

All returned items are being quarantined for 48 hours before they are checked in. Special book bins are placed in the Lobby for any library books and textbooks being returned.


















# 5 Tips for Success in the IB Program

### 1. Study with a routine!

An effective study strategy is a must. Develop an efficient and productive study routine because it helps eliminate confusion as a clear action plan emerges with a little thinking and planning. It also imparts a sense of direction.

Here's a strategy you can use




The #1 rookie mistake students make is throwing all their time on one subject per day. Every subject needs a bit of love and attention.


- **Let's get more specific: time.** Spend one hour on three to four different subjects per day, every day. For your weaker subjects, 2 hours would berequired. This means around 4 hours of regular study every day if you want to do extremely well in the IB.
- Have an organized timetable!
  - It ensures that you study a **healthy range** of subjects every day
  - It ensures that you give **equal attention** to all subjects. Make sure you do 3 x one-hour study sessions for each subject every week.

### 2. Stay ahead

An effective study strategy is a must. Develop an efficient and productive study routine because it helps eliminate confusion as a clear action plan emerges with a We are successful when we are prepared.



One way to excel in the IB is to stay ahead of the class material. Staying ahead means **preparing early**. Don't wait for your teacher to cover the content in class. Use **holidays and weekends** to begin learning new content independently. Use class time as clarification, revision, and consolidation. Early preparation also reduces stress during the academic term—a big plus. thinking and planning. It also imparts a sense of direction.

# 3. Use the subject guides, aka train tracks

The IB outlines exactly what you need to know for your exams. This magical information is all contained in the corresponding **subject guides**. It's pretty much a train track. Follow it and you'll get to where you need to go.



### 4. Be proactive and ask for help

Never leave problems unsolved. Deal with problems in your understanding immediately. Knowledge is like a house of cards. You need a solid foundation (basic skills) before you can build the beautiful arches and domes at the top (advanced skills). If you build on a weak foundation, everything you learn later in the course will not be able to hold itself up. "London bridge is falling down..." Avoid these troubles by ensuring your complete understanding of course material when it is being taught.

- Ask your teacher
- Consult YouTube
- Ask a friend.

### 5. Don't be too late!

Don't be that guy who makes

notes for two years' worth of IB content in the month before finals. You won't get good results. Learning is like marinating a chicken. For knowledge to seep into the deep crevices of your brain, you need to consistently and regularly immerse yourself in the subject content for two years — not a few weeks!
