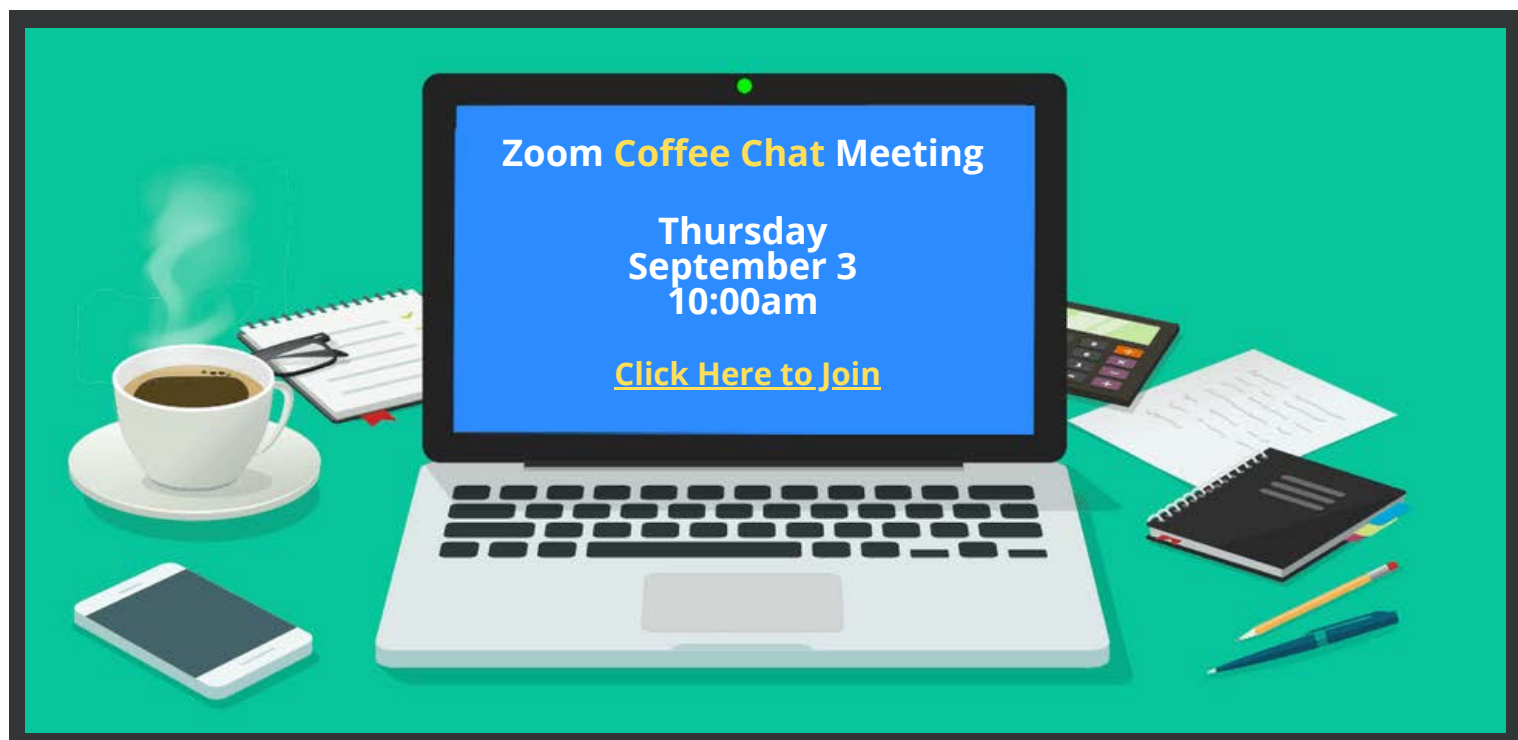

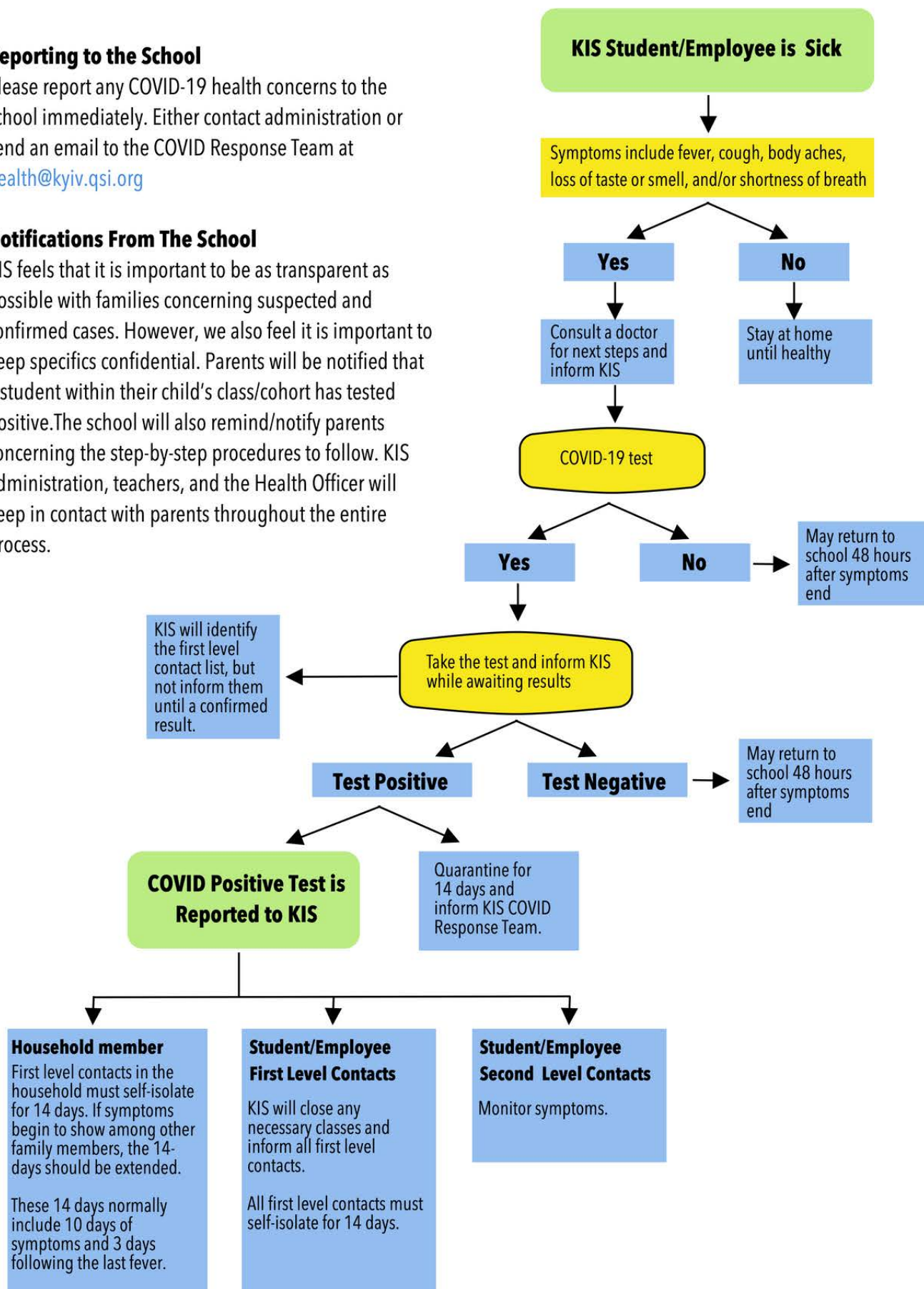
# KYIV INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL COVID REPORTING PROCEDURES FLOWCHART

## Notifications From The School

KIS feels that it is important to be as transparent as possible with families concerning suspected and confirmed cases. However, we also feel it is important to keep specifics confidential. Parents will be notified that a student within their child's class/cohort has tested positive. The school will also remind/notify parents concerning the step-by-step procedures to follow. KIS administration, teachers, and the Health Officer will keep in contact with parents throughout the entire process.





# KIS Parking, Traffic, Drop Off, and Pick Up Guidelines

Unfortunately, this year Kyiv International School campus will be generally closed to all parents and visitors. We will be accommodating parents and visitors who have appointments for any school business.

**Green Zone** - Parent and visitor parking only - open at all times.

**Morning Drop Off — (7:50 - 8:30)**

- Students will not be able to be dropped off before 7:50
- 5yo- S4 Students will need to be dropped off outside the guard check.
- Cars will be permitted to drive through the campus for traffic flow purposes.
- Parents wishing to drop off high school students in the back may drive through campus, but must drop off students outside the back gate. Students should go straight to their classroom.

**Yellow Zone** – Inside Parking Lot

**Afternoon Pick Up — (3:00-4:00)**

- Parents and caregivers will be able to park in the yellow zone to pick up students, but are not permitted to enter the campus.
- Please, wait outside or in your car until your child finds you.
- KIS staff will be outside to help locate parents/caregivers.
- Once you have picked up your child, you must leave the campus.



Wear a mask at all times while on campus for pick up.



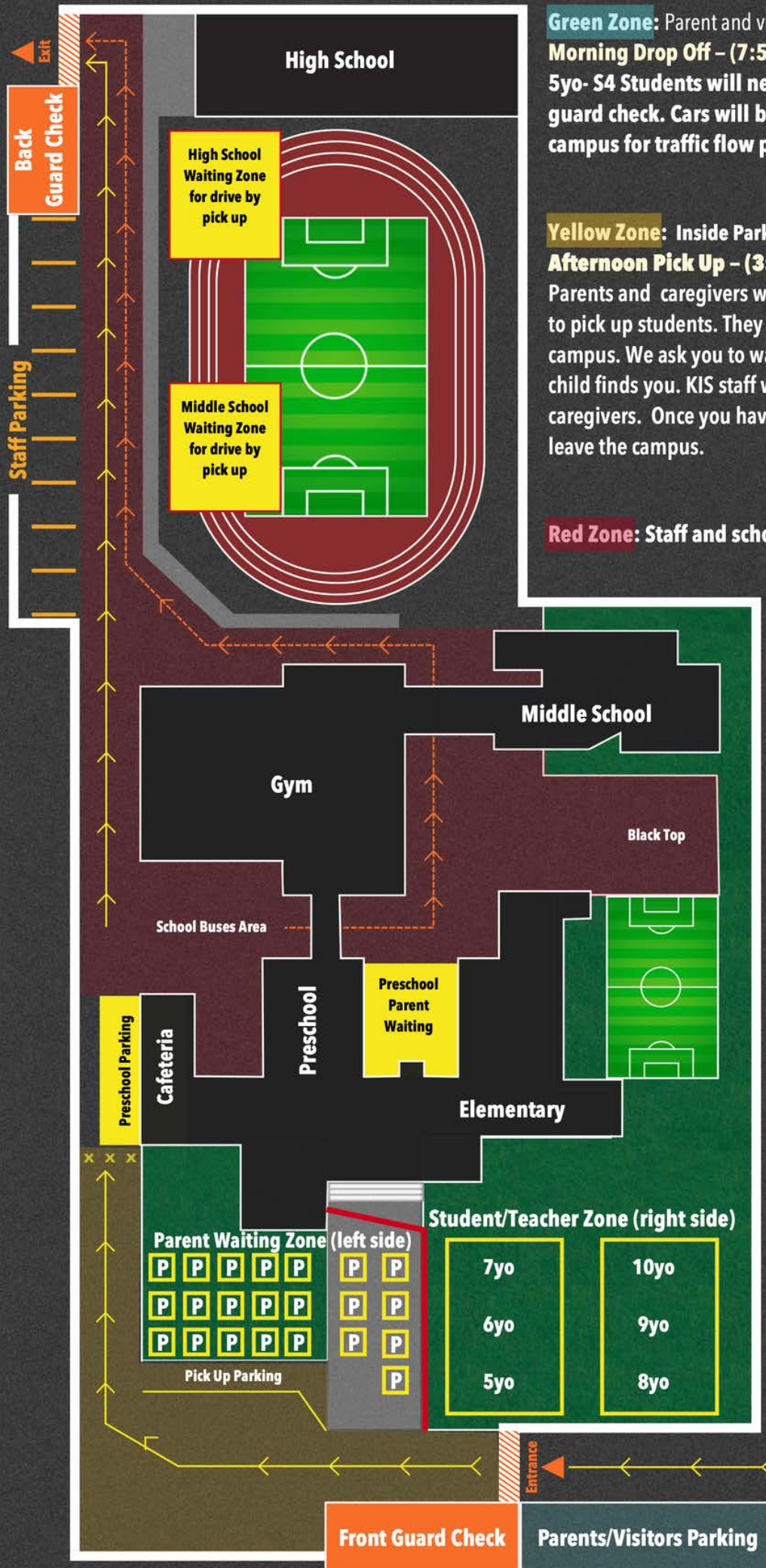
Spread out and keep socially distant from other parents and caregivers.



Please, do not stay on the campus grounds or let children use the playground.

**Red Zone** - Staff and school bus parking only





**Green Zone:** Parent and visitor parking only - open at all times.

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5yo- S4 Students will need to be dropped off outside the guard check. Cars will be permitted to drive through the campus for traffic flow purposes.

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**Afternoon Pick Up - (3:00-4:00)**

Parents and caregivers will be able to park in the yellow zone to pick up students. They are not permitted to enter the campus. We ask you to wait outside or in your car until your child finds you. KIS staff will be outside to help locate parents/caregivers. Once you have picked up your child, you must leave the campus.

**Red Zone:** Staff and school bus parking only

**Middle School and Secondary Students** can be picked up by driving through towards the back and picking them up from the field.

If they would like to meet a parent or driver at the front, they will need to walk to the front gate and exit from there.

**Middle school should take outdoor routes to the right side and Secondary along the left.**

Parents should not be parking and getting out near the field.

**Preschool Parking** will be along the left side of the campus near the preschool area. Parents may park and drop off students at the preschool entrance.

**Elementary parents** and caregivers may park outside campus and the front parking area. They can wait on the left side of the sidewalk in the playground area to meet their child.



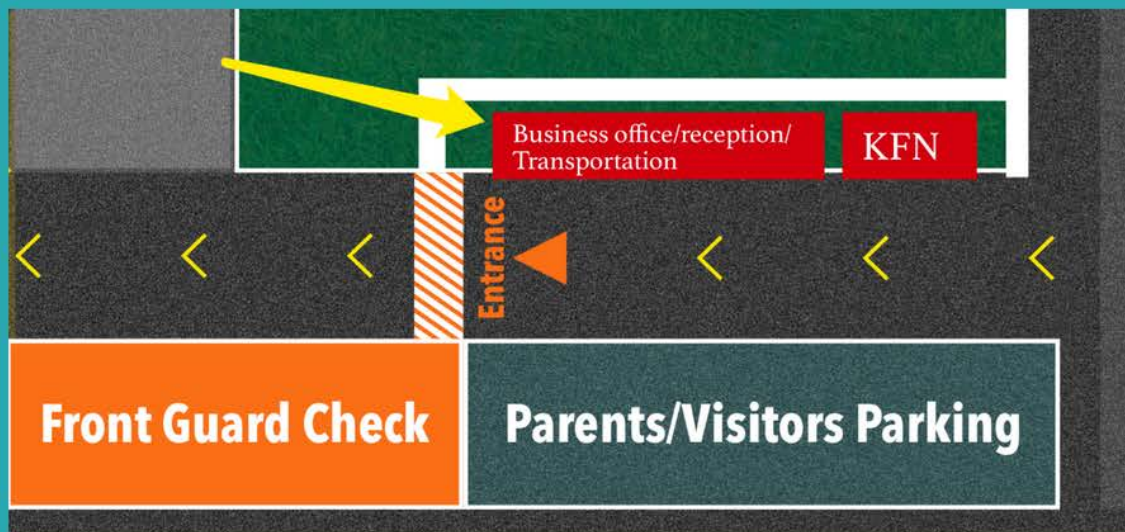
# Campus Security & ID's

## Car Access Stickers

You will notice there is a special car sticker for preschool parents who will need to park on campus to drop their children off at a side door for a temperature check and entry.

All adults planning to be on campus must have an ID. If you do not have one already, please arrange to register for one from reception, and wear it at all times while at the school.

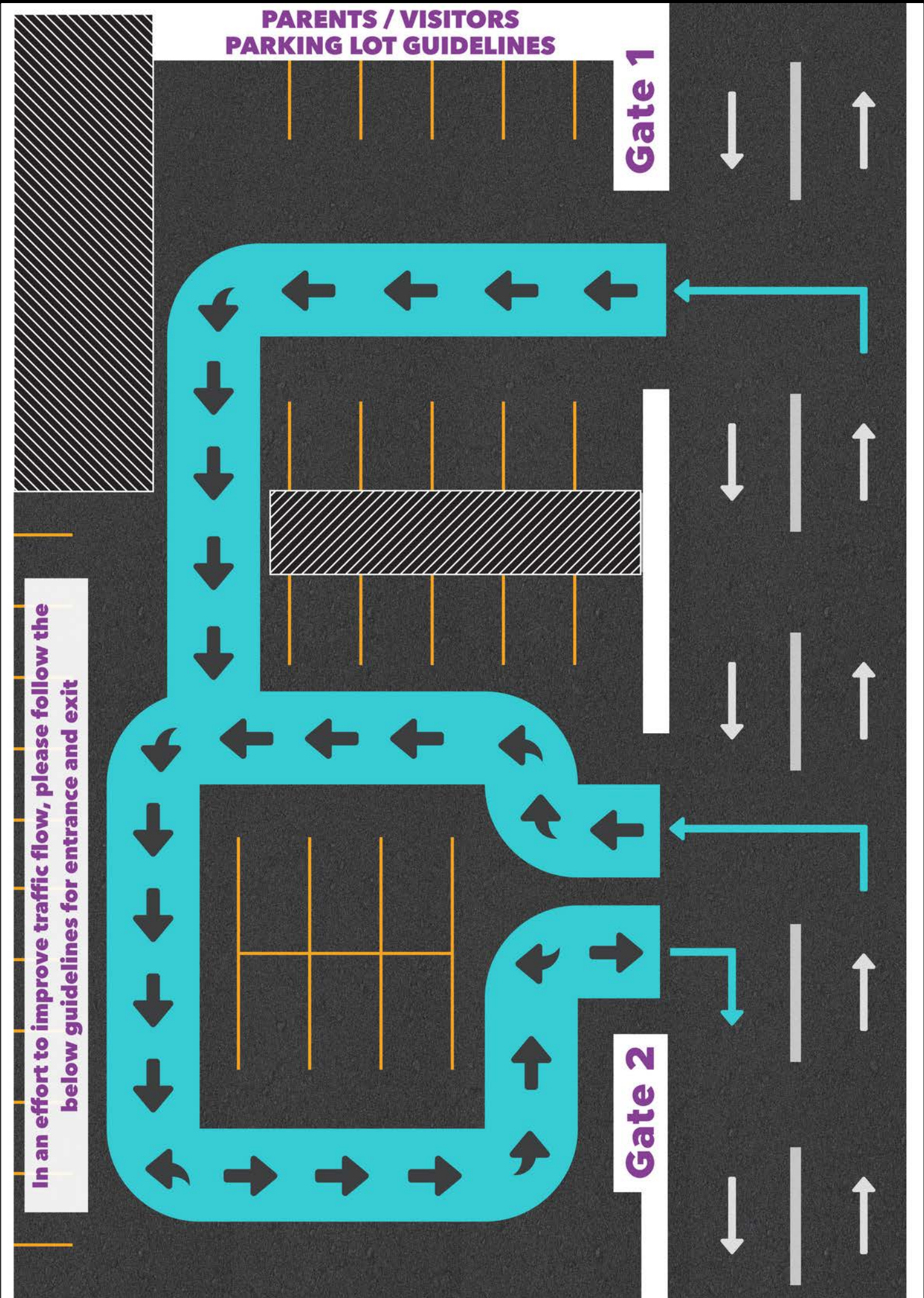
## Closed Campus

### What should I bring?

- Mask
- Pencils
- Eraser
- ID (Student ID or Passport)
- Admissions Ticket
- Water & Snack
- An approved Calculator
- Watch with no alarm
- Extra Batteries

### What should I NOT Bring:

- Electronic devices of any kind
- Highlighters, colored pens/pencils
- Mechanical pencils
- Dictionaries
- Study materials
- Drinks other than water

**\*If you bring a prohibited item you are subject to be dismissed from the exam and your score will be canceled with no refund.**

### What should I expect on testing day:

- To answer medical questions
- Only test takers allowed on campus
- My ID and admissions ticket checked
- Smaller testing rooms that have test takers spaced appropriately
- Required to wear a mask.
- Only access to the Secondary Building.
- All other buildings are off limits.
- NO AC. Windows will be open for proper ventilation.

\*Please arrive to the exam by 8:00am. Check-in will begin at 7:30am and stop at 8:00am. Late comers will not be admitted.

\* Please plan to walk through security with a mask on.

\*Temperatures will be checked upon arrival.

\*A medical survey will be taken and must be signed by the test taker.

\*Check-in will take place outside once you have passed through security.

\*Test takers will then be directed around the main building, walking only outside, towards the Secondary Building.

\*Testing will take place in Secondary Building due to the schools regulations during the pandemic.

\*DO NOT attend testing if you are sick, are supposed to be on quarantine, or have come in contact with someone who has Covid-19. KIS is not responsible for the risk you take entering our testing center.

## Bring Your Own Device

### Upper Elementary (8yo+), Middle School & Secondary Students

More and more students are bringing their computers, tablets, and other devices to school to use as a learning resource to complete school assignments, research topics, and keep track of homework and school events. **All KIS Upper Elementary (8yo +) Middle School and Secondary students will need to have their own personal device to use as a resource at school.** It is also possible that KIS may need to temporarily move to online learning. In such circumstances, it is important that students are equip to transition quickly to continue with the school's Virtual Learning Environment.

#### BYOD Resources:

- **Microsoft 365 – School Email Account, Teams, Microsoft Office, etc.**

Student will have a school email account and cloud storage via Microsoft 365, which will allow teachers and students to share and edit documents. There are also a number of apps and programs related to the Microsoft 365 platform.

- **Digital Version of Textbooks**

Online textbooks and resources will be available for students to use. Paper textbooks will still be used and available, but not mandatory.

- **Online Programs and Resources**

There are a number of online resources and programs that a teacher may use

#### Possible Devices:

- Laptops – Macbooks, Chromebooks, or any other type of laptop.
- 2 in 1's – Can double as a tablet and computer (Microsoft Surface)
- Must be able to print from device.
- Must have a keyboard in order to do word processing.
- Minimum of one USB port.



#### Device specifications

**1) Wireless connectivity** – Devices must support 2.4GHz and 5GHz dual band, 802.11 a, b, g and n wireless so that they can connect to the school WiFi.

**2) Battery life** - Devices must last at least 3-5 hours without charge so that it can last through multiple classes throughout the school day.

**3) Memory and RAM** - Devices must have a minimum 16 GB of free (available) storage and 8 GB RAM so that students have enough space to save their work and have a device that is fast to work with.

**4) Operating system** - Devices should have the current version of any operating system (Eg. MacOS13, iOS13, Windows 10) so the device can access the latest software/apps and updates. If this is not possible, a previous version of any operating system should be installed on devices (Eg. iOS11, Windows 8) but proper use of all applications is not guaranteed.

**5) Hardware features** - Devices must have a camera and microphone to allow students to participate in 21st century learning. Students may also find a mouse and stylus helpful.





*The **Middle and Secondary School Student Life program** offers a wide variety of opportunities over the course of the school year. The focus of the program is to promote student engagement on campus; nurture leadership skills, increase teamwork and positive group dynamics; and develop the individual and team skills needed for student athletes to be successful at the Secondary School level.*

### **After-School Activities for Middle School and Secondary students will begin September 14th.**

We encourage ALL our Middle and Secondary students to get involved and try something new this fall! Registration for the FALL 2020 after school sports and activities will open on August 31st and close on September 7th.

Registration is through **PARENTS' Moodle** and students must be registered by their parents.
