KIS Campus will remain closed by the end of the year

KIS administration, QSI headquarters, and the KIS Advisory Board have all agreed and made the difficult decision that KIS should keep the campus closed for the remainder of this school year and continue with our Online Learning Plan until our last scheduled school day (June 19th).

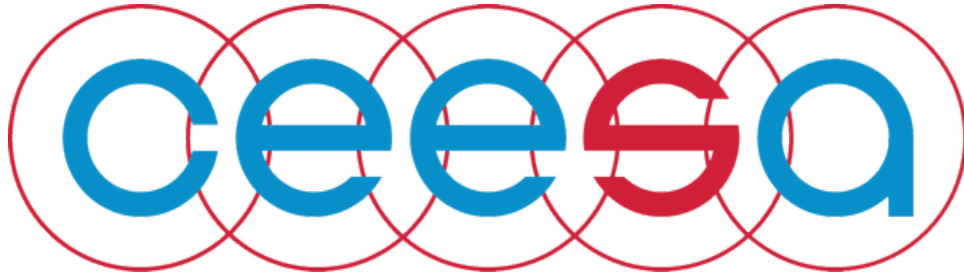

FALL SEASON CEESA ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES - 2020 / 2021

After much consideration, the CEESA Directors have advised that there will not be any on-site CEESA events in the fall of 2020 (Season One). They will look to reconvene CEESA events from January 2021 (Season Two). This is upsetting news for our student athletes and participants in our CEESA activities. However, considering the complexity of crossing borders and envisioning what travel may look like in October and November it seems to be a reasonable decision.

The CEESA Athletic Directors are considering ways to adapt and modify CEESA events and seasons to ensure that students continue to have the opportunity to engage in all athletics and activities. These include virtual events and the possibility of moving athletic events to different seasons.

The Kozaks are planning to start the fall season with training for football and cross country based on the restrictions set by the school and the government in Ukraine. We plan to have local tournaments with the teams in the KSSL and will consider the possibility of invitational tournaments, depending on the situation in Ukraine and other countries. We also plan to have Middle School Robotics and to participate in a Robotics Tournament.

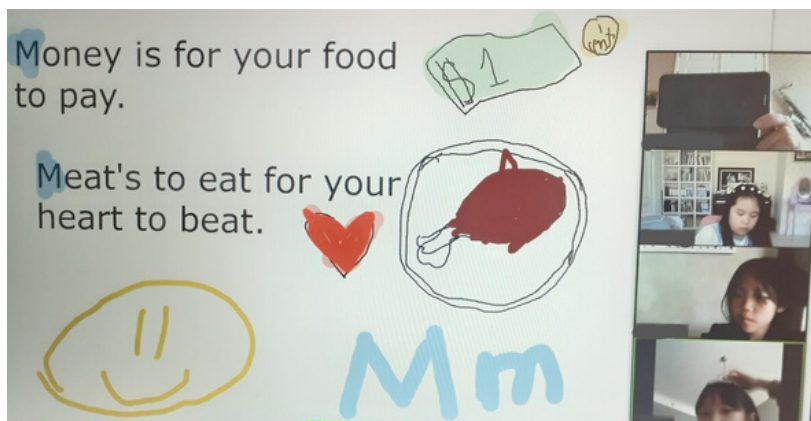
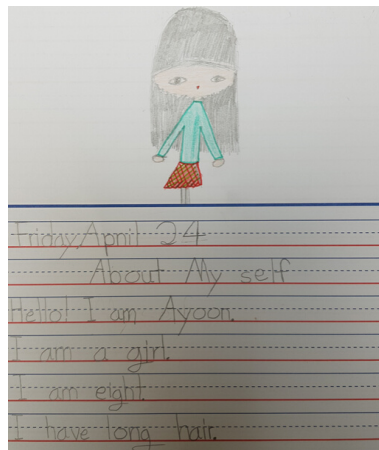
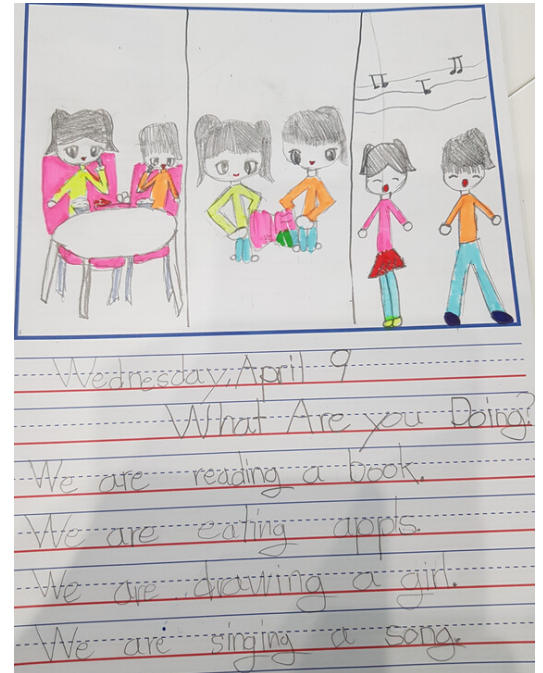


INTENSIVE ENGLISH ELEMENTARY

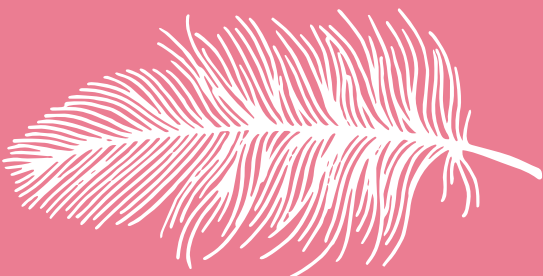
I was a student at KIS

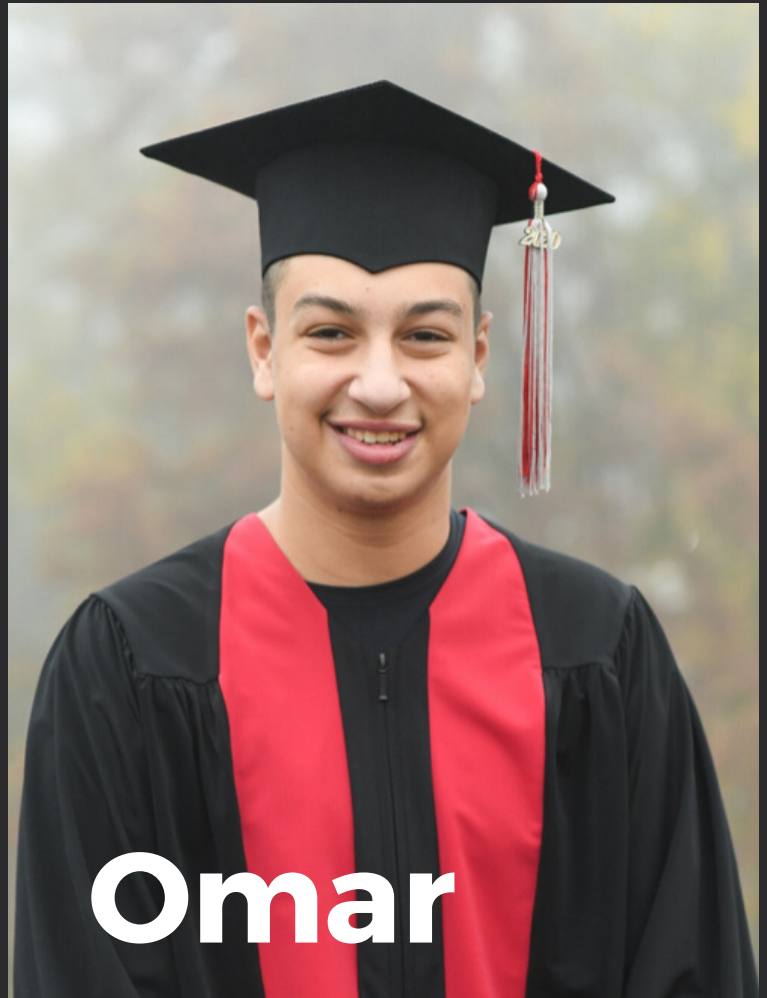

Oskar will attend either University of Warsaw or Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznan. He wants to major either in English and Russian or in International relations.

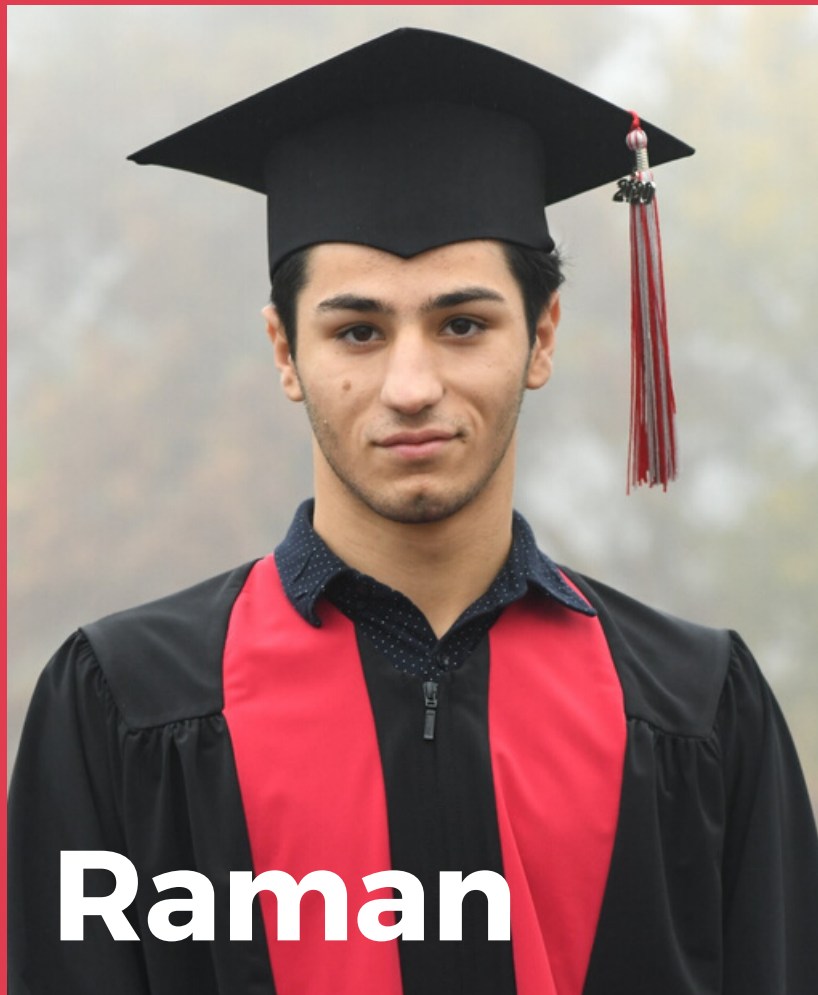

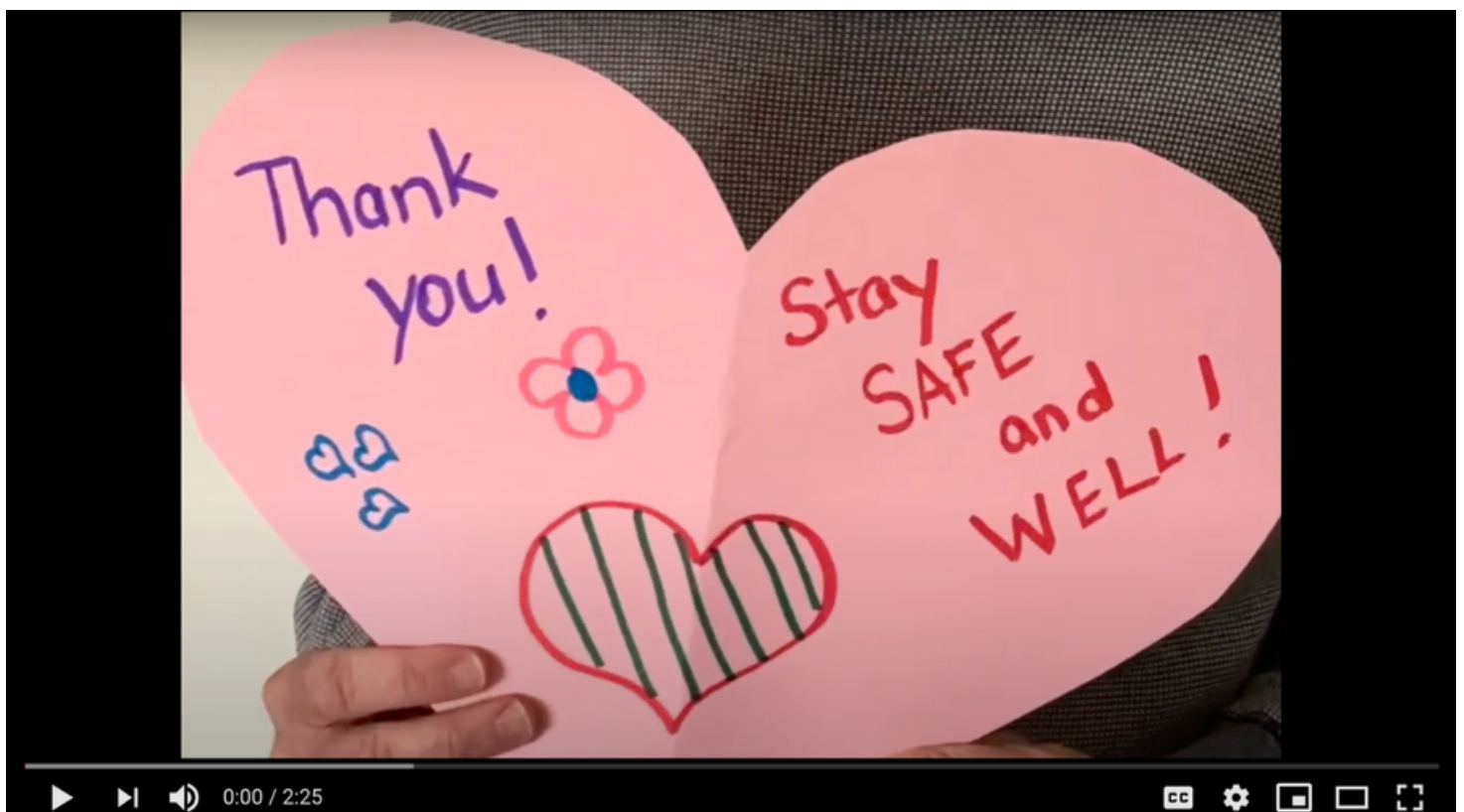
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

AND RESOURCE CHECKIN

Dear All,

This is the time of the year when the Librarians need to collect all library books and textbooks. This year nothing is normal, so we came up with the following plan.



Books Bin

- **Library Book Returns (May 12-June 5)**

Process: The main gate will have bins for people to drop off library books (Saturday-Tuesday bins and Wednesday-Friday bins). These bins will then be swapped out and left for 48 hrs before the library team checks them in and reshelves them. The cycle of bins available will continue until June 5th. The sooner these items are returned and checked in, the better. Please, try to bring the library books from all children/members in the family at once. Returning items now will make the end-of-the-year-check-in process for your family smoother.



Middle School Area

- **Textbook Returns**

Process: Books will be returned to the middle school area on an announced schedule for return. Students will also use this scheduled time to clean out their lockers and collect personal items. Library staff will be equipped with masks and gloves in order to receive the books, check them in, and store them over the summer. Textbooks will then be checked out to students from the same location in August.

- Senior Week - May 25-29
- Secondary School - June 1-5
- Middle School - June 8-12
- Upper Elementary - Schedule pending

This week you will be receiving the lists of books and textbooks to be returned. It will allow you some time to look for them, match the barcodes, etc. We would ask you to be very organized and submit the materials preferably all at once packed in any kind of plastic bag with a note from who they are from. Your books will not be checked in on the day you bring them to school to allow 48 hours of quarantine. With that being said, please, proceed with the returning of your textbooks as soon as you hear from your DI.

Dear Parents!

In order to give you the opportunity to have some wonderful books for summer, KIS has decided to open the **Online Scholastic Book Club one more time this year! This time the ordering period will be shortened so that we can hopefully receive your books before the end of the school year. The estimated time of arrival is the 14th-19th of June. Please note this is the estimated date of arrival and is subject the change.**

Before you place an order, please, consider the following:

- you have to be in Kyiv till the end of June to be able to pick up your order from school
- if you need to leave earlier for summer you agree to pick up your order in August/September from school. School is not shipping the orders.

What is a Scholastic Book club?

Two or three times a year, KIS gives the opportunity to order quality children's books at discounted price from Scholastic Book Club. The books Scholastic offers are carefully chosen to get children reading for pleasure - and to keep them reading right through their teenage years. There is no obligation to order, but for every €1 that parents spend on a school's Book Club order they'll donate 20¢ in FREE BOOKS back to the school*.

As a librarian I set up a new Book Club order via Scholastic's website. I share the unique Scholastic website address with you below. Parents and children go online to browse the latest Book Club range.

Parents order and pay securely online. Your child's teacher will receive the order, so please remember to choose your homeroom teacher before paying for your books. The books are delivered to school for **FREE**.

Here are the steps you need to take:

1. Go to the school's Scholastic Webpage <http://eu-schools.scholastic.co.uk/qsi-kyiv-international> - you will see QSI in the top right hand corner.
2. Select which books you would you like - to do this click "BUY"
3. When orders get close to £80.00 or 100\$ please proceed to checkout. There will be a summary of the order, click check out again. You can always open another with the same date straight after. This way the company can keep the orders going through customs without issues/delays.
4. It will ask you to register your email address or if you are a returning customer to log in using your email address and password.
5. Choose which book club basket/teacher you would like to place the order into. Your child's teacher will receive your order and pass it on to you.
6. Make payments for your books.

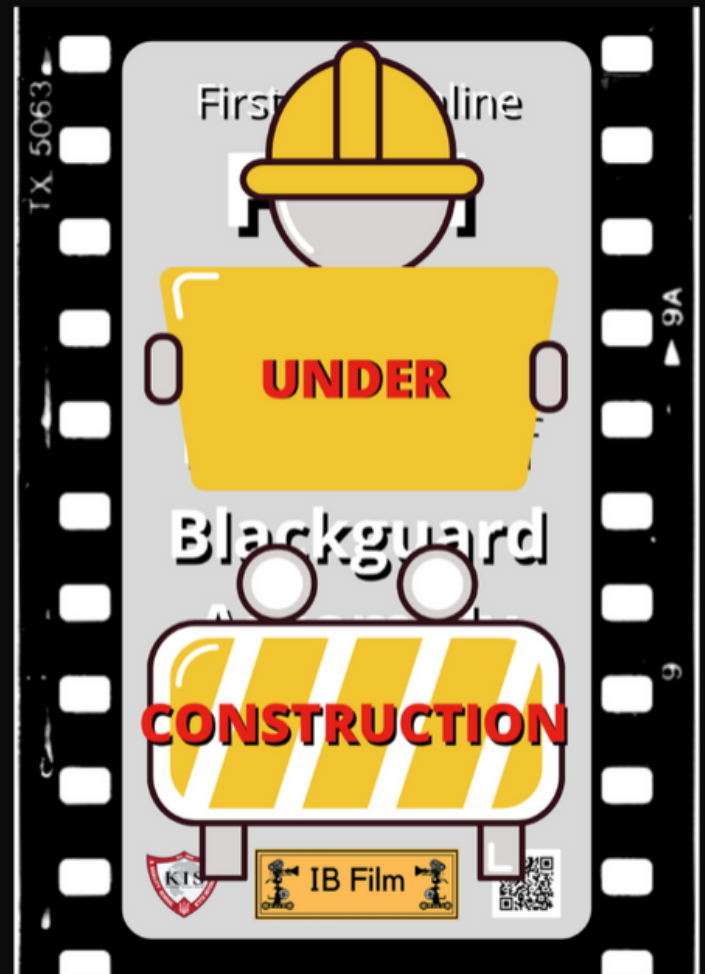

SUMMER SCHOOL

Dear Parents,

I have been asked to consult with the school community to determine if there is interest in attending a summer school this year. The developments relating to the Coronavirus Pandemic, social distancing, and quarantining of the public in Kyiv and Country of Ukraine, have created a very different, new, and sensitive set of circumstances that will likely impact the manner in which we will be able to run a summer school program.

It is clear that the distance learning delivery of education is a viable option and may have to be the approach for the summer school this year. Since the situation we are subjected to changes with little lead time, it may be the only manner to operate a summer school program for now.

While the at home education is an option, there is a possibility that the government may allow the opening up of schools with significant restrictions in place to safe guard the students, and staff involved. If this is the situation then we would need to know if you as a parent would be agreeable to these new conditions, where the school complies with government standards, and allow your son or daughter to participate in an on campus summer school. Our back up plan would be to continue the current distance learning. We may be able to introduce a hybrid of the two formats where students are allowed on campus in small groups to interact with teachers and then do the remainder of their work in consultation with their teachers at home. I need to know your preferences by the deadline for S.S. applications by checking the appropriate box on the registration form, and then sending the application form to the school on or before June 1st, 2020.

The school is working on developing an on-line registration form that can be filled in and sent to the school electronically. Please watch for additional advertisements, information in the KK, e-mail, or the other information circulars from the school.

Summer School Application

2020

Kyiv International School's Summer Program is designed for those students who have not completed required units during the 2019-2020 school year. Participants will work with a qualified teacher to finish required assignments for unfinished units or will be expected to do all assigned work for a unit not yet begun. An end of the unit assessment is normally required to complete a unit and when a satisfactory grade is achieved the student will be awarded a passing grade of "B". Any units that a student would like to attempt to finish during summer school must be preapproved by the current teacher and the Director of Instruction, Mr. S. Legan, or Mr. J. Temple. Students who have completed less than 7 units in a subject are normally not allowed to attend summer school. Such courses are usually rescheduled in the next academic year. In extenuating circumstances, with the approval of a DI, a student may be allowed to attend SS with less than seven completed units. This decision will be made at the discretion of the individual DI's.

<u>Week 1</u>	June 22 – June 26
<u>Week 2</u>	June 29—July 3

The minimum registration fee is \$350 per week and students must prepay a \$60 non-refundable deposit along with this application. When work is satisfactorily completed and fees are paid grades will be posted on the school web site. **Summer school registration will close on Wednesday, May 25th, 2020.**

When this application is received, summer school staff will begin collecting materials, books, teacher reports and unit information to optimize the summer school experience.

School rules are still in place during summer school and students found violating school rules will be removed from the program without refund.

Classes run from 9:00 am-3:00 pm each day and there will be no bus service. Students interested in lunch may order from local restaurants and have the food delivered to the school.

Summer School enrolment is being limited to 40 students per week to provide the optimum learning environment. Students will be accepted on a first come first served basis. The decision to limit enrolment is the responsibility of the Director of Instruction or the Summer School Administrator.
