



Parent Teacher Conferences Friday, October 23, 2020

Don't worry, there's no dynamite involved other than student's brain power and clever creativity!


Parents' of Mrs. Butler's students, we are in need of a box with a lid for your child.


Becoming a teacher was my childhood dream. I value my role supporting children in their learning journey, and looking forward for another great successful school year.


CROSS COUNTRY AT KIS
