that there has been no in-school transmission. I believe this to be a result of our <u>Health and Safety</u> guidelines as well as the commitment of our campus community to help <u>#stopthespread</u>.

These past two weeks have provided us the opportunity to clear most of our first-level contact quarantines and will allow most of our staff to return to campus.

There have been a few questions related to when someone can return to campus if they or someone in their household has had COVID-19. We appreciate your support in all the precautionary measures that have been in place this year in order to keep our community healthy and safe.

HOT CHOCOLATE DAY

So as this is the 10th year enjoying this delicious tradition, I wanted to share the recipe for the Hot Chocolate mix, that we have been using over the past 9 years, with our favorite Kozak Nation.

We can't be together at school but we can enjoy the tradition on our own from home. I am attaching two recipes for you to try.

One is for four cups of Hot Chocolate and the other is the large batch that we use to make enough for the whole school. The big batch is for 50 cups and when duplicated can serve our school. You can make the large batch and enjoy the drink for several weeks or more if you want.

Both make the same mixture and will produce a lovely hot cup of chocolate for you to enjoy on this first day of SNOW.

Hot Cocoa - Recipe for 4 Cups

Ingredients:

Combine:


2 tablespoons (30ml) of cocoa – *see photo below*

3 - 4 tablespoons (45 - 60 ml) of sugar

1/8th tsp/1/2 a ml of salt


1 cup of powdered milk (1 package or 250 grams) - see photo below

1 teaspoon (5ml) vanilla sugar (1/2 a package of vanilla sugar) - see photo below

MR. & MRS. BATEMAN'S SPECIAL FIRST DAY OF SNOW

Hot Cocoa - Recipe for 50 Cups

Ingredients:

Combine:

1 cup of cocoa - (2 packages of 100 grams) - see photo below

2 cups of sugar

1 tsp/5 milliliters of salt

8 cups of powdered milk (4 packages of 250 grams) - see photo below

8 teaspoons of vanilla (4 packages of vanilla sugar) - see photo below

Stir all dry ingredients together and store in a container in a dry place. Makes approximately 50 cups. Mix 2 to 4 tablespoons of mix (according to taste) with cold water and stir until a smooth paste, then add hot water and mix again.

If you follow these instructions, you should have creamy smooth delicious hot cocoa.








LOVIN' IT... 9






MR. HERNDON'S PE CLASSES


