Today was a fantastic day in the four-year-old Preschool Pod! Cooking with preschoolers can be such an adventure; there's always great joy and a huge mess at the same time. Mrs. Durham, Mrs. Shefner and Mrs. Buck experienced this adventure again, today.

The four-year-old students in all three classes were introduced to the old tale titled The Stone Soup. The Stone Soup is a European folk story in which hungry strangers convince the townspeople to each share a small amount of their food in order to make a meal that everyone enjoys. This story is a beautiful example of the value of sharing and working together.

In addition to listening to the story and acting out the story, the students also gathered produce from around their classroom. The students cleaned the produce, cut the vegetables, and added their contribution, along with the stone, to the pot.

There is beauty in connecting the ideas of gratitude for what we have and blending the idea of generosity in giving and sharing. The life skills of gratitude and generosity are better *"caught"* than *"taught."* May we fill our lives with gratitude and generosity.





## **KIS is Painting the World with Kindness!**

In October, we as a pre-school and elementary community expressed our concern for others by donating to our "Funds for Fangs" project. The project brought in a total of 26,043 uah! One way students gave was by showing concern for others and "earning" a donation give. Through our giving, we sponsored 30 children to receive routine dental care through the work of Loads of Love, an organization that supports the needs of orphans and the elderly around Ukraine. A display was placed in the lobby to help students visualize their giving. While each pumpkin represented 100uah, the graph was quickly overloaded with pumpkins!



## **Breaking Out in MS Literacy**

The 12 year old students in Mrs. Herndon's Literature classes found new ways to break out of their comfort zones by working collaboratively to solve puzzles, reveal codes, and unlock the boxes. The Minecraft-themed Breakout Box contained cross-curricular riddles that engaged the students in 4C Education (communication, collaboration, creative thinking, and creativity), set to the soundtrack of epic adventure music. Afterwards, students were asked to engage their SEL skills and reflect on what they learned about each other and themselves during the course of the breakout box, which puzzles were the most challenging for them and why, and what ideas they had for creating new boxes in the future.


