



You may have thought audiobooks were just for students or adults who had trouble with reading, or for people who are too lazy to pick up a book. In fact, there are multiple benefits to audiobooks, and you may find that audiobooks may be the key to your student loving books.

Audiobooks may be a welcome alternative

Perhaps your student struggles with reading. They may be in a novel study for class and the act of reading the book is causing negative responses. Audiobooks may be a way for your student to connect with the book and enjoy the book without having to struggle with sounding out the words.

Audiobooks can help improve your comprehension and vocabulary

Listening to the narrator will increase the mind's ability to comprehend what is happening in the story because the student is not so focused on sounding out words. Being able to hear higher-level vocabulary will increase the listener's understanding of these words.

Can help improve pronunciation and fluency

Listening to audiobooks can increase your fluency and pronunciation. You will be able to hear the narrator pronounce the different words. You will be able to her the pauses, stresses, and speed which is crucial for fluency.

Builds critical listening skills

To fully understand an audiobook, the listener must listen attentively. With practice, your student will build their critical thinking and judgment.

Improve focus, attention span, memory

When listening to an audiobook, you need to stay focused to understand what is happening. Combining the audiobooks with following along in the book will help maintain this focus. Students will not tire as easily while listening to an audiobook.

Audiobooks may help our brains better imagine the story

The narrator can help to enhance the flow and feel of the story. This will help the listener to create images in their mind and imagine what characters look like and what they are doing. This will help the listener to better understand the plot and character development.

We highly recommend supplementing your student's library books with audiobooks!
