CHEER TAKES FIRST AT MHSAA REGIONAL

The Notre Dame Competitive Cheer team took first at the MHSAA Regional competitive held at Novi High School to earn a sport in the MHSAA State finals. After sitting in fourth place following round one with a score of 230.40, a strong second round score of 221.02 moved the Irish up to second place following two rounds, trailing only Flat Rock. Notre Dame would post the second highest round three score of the night with a 312.60 to finish with a final score of 764.02. The Irish would edge out second-place Croswell-Lexington, who finished with a score of 764.00, by only .02 points. Flat Rock placed third while Richmond came in fourth. The top four teams now move on to the MHSAA State Finals held at the Breslin Center on the campus of Michigan State University.
