SCHOLARSHIPS:

We the Students Scholarship Essay Contest

Sixteen student winners will receive a total of \$20,000 in scholarship prizes. The essay prompt this year: What is the relationship between equality and justice? The Men's Club of Temple Beth El Scholarships

Two separate awards are available to members of the Stamford and Fairfield County area high school graduating classes, who are of the Jewish faith and who will pursue accredited programs of higher education in the forthcoming academic year.

- The **Edward J. Kaplin Memorial Scholarship** is a grant given in equal parts over a four-year period. The award is made based on an overall assessment of the following criteria: academic achievement, financial need, character, and citizenship.
- The **Eve K. Kaplin Memorial Scholarship** is a one-year grant. The award is made to an applicant who has demonstrated talent in the fine or performing arts and whose career objective is to develop their talent. The award is based on an overall assessment of the following criteria: Demonstrated talent, academic achievement, financial need, character, and citizenship.

Minimum GPA of 3.5, demonstrated leadership potential and record of community service also required. First County Bank Foundation Richard E. Taber Citizenship Award

Three \$5,000 scholarships to high school seniors who hold a "B" average or higher. This scholarship seeks students who have developed a new or unusual solution to an artistic, scientific or technical problem faced by their family, school or community. Glenn Moon Scholarship/Association of Retired Teachers of Connecticut (ARTC)

2021 graduates of secondary schools in Connecticut are eligible IF they are committed to pursuing a career in the field of education. Scholarships to be awarded are one four-year scholarship of \$2000 for 4 years (The winner must maintain college grades in the upper bracket and must continue teacher preparation training.) PLUS one 1-year scholarship of \$1500. Students must use the 2021 online application and directions for mailing found on the [Association of Retired Teachers of Connecticut website](#). Applicants should print a hardcopy, complete the application and mail it to the board member for their high school as listed on the website.
