The Brownsville Learning Academy Middle School (BLA) is operated by the Brownsville Independent School District to serve the educational needs of young adults for whom the traditional school setting is not appropriate. Beginning in 2017, BLA became a standalone, alternative secondary school. The campus is registered with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and is subject to all the requirements of a normal secondary campus. We serve students from 6th to 8th grade. The competency-based learning system provides an alternative program with flexible scheduling for young adults unable to complete a traditional middle school program.

BLA Middle School serves residents of Brownsville I.S.D. BLA Middle School is designed to serve those individuals who are self-disciplined, strongly motivated, over-age, committed to furthering their education in a self-paced environment, and require no disciplinary correction. All the usual benefits which are provided to BISD schools such as transportation, cafeteria services, etc. are also provided to students at BLA Middle School.

BLA provides a professional staff of teachers, a full-time counselor, an assistant principal, a testing coordinator, a secretary, a data entry clerk and other support staff. BLA Middle School offers advice with career guidance and preparation.

The mastery learning curriculum used at BLA allows students to progress at their own rate. In addition, our middle school students have the opportunity to accumulate high school credits using computer-assisted technology, textbooks, learning modules or one-on-one and small group instruction. Students demonstrate 70% mastery of each competency before moving to the next performance objective.
