RE: Rescue Medications During and After School Hours

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Fortunately, TMISD provides many opportunities for students to be in competitions, athletic events, ROTC events, band events etc. Many of these events occur outside of normal school hours. This has become quite challenging for the school nurses to keep up with each student and the events they are involved in. To help assure your child's safety, we need your help.

DURING SCHOOL HOURS

- Parent/guardian or student should contact the school nurse 24 hours before the event to make sure rescue medication (Epi-Pens, Inhalers, Glucagon and medications) is with the student and the medication accompanies them to the event they are attending or involved with, especially at the secondary levels (Middle School, High School).

AFTER SCHOOL HOURS

- When your child is involved in an activity, for example: athletics, ROTC, band, etc. **the parent/guardian is responsible for planning for and providing rescue medications to the sponsors or teacher**, such as Epi-Pen for allergies, Inhalers for asthmatics and Glucagon for diabetics and any other supplies they may need.
- **The school nurse does not send rescue medications with students on events outside of normal school hours. (Epi-Pens, Inhalers, Glucagon and diabetic supplies).**
