Mastery Learning

QSI believes in 'Success for All' and that all students can achieve at a high level given enough time and feedback. Mastery learning is the instructional strategy used in all QSI schools. Small class sizes allow the teacher to keep working with a child until the child demonstrates a high level of understanding on each topic of study.

<u>Curriculum</u>

The Preschool program provides an American style, developmentally appropriate program of instruction. Students learn through meaningful activities including logical and critical thinking, problem solving, pre-mathematics skills, fine motor and gross motor skills, visual and auditory discrimination, vocabulary development, following directions, eye-hand coordination, independent thinking and spatial perception.

<u>Placement</u>

The Preschool program is designed for children ages 2 to 4. Children are placed by age. Children entering a class must reach the appropriate age (2 for 2-year-olds, 3 for 3-year-olds, 4 for 4-year-olds) no later than October 31 of the year they enter. Students in the preschool program should be pottytrained.

<u>A Preschool School Day</u>

Students follow a routine each school day:

- 1) Calendar and Song Time 5) Story Time/Fine Motor Skills
- 2) Vocabulary Development 6) Lunch
- 3) Specialist Classes 7) Nap Time
 - 8) Afternoon Skills Development

*Specialist classes are offered on rotation and include: Art, Music, Physical Education, Chinese and Cooperation Team Building.

*Once a week, students engage in a Keeping Safe Lesson.

Snack and Naptime

The Preschool program provides one healthy snack in the morning and one in the afternoon. Naptime takes place each afternoon after lunch. Students should bring their own bedding and a pillow to be comfortable. Bottles are not allowed. Students who no longer nap are able to go to an "awake room" where they work on quiet activities focusing on fine motor skills development.

Assessment at QSI

Preschool students receive a Growth Report three times per year. These reports will be emailed home. Below are the evaluations used by QSI in the preschool program:

- **<u>S</u> Satisfactory:** The student understands the topic or can complete the task
- <u>**P Progressing:**</u> The student is working toward understanding of one or more objectives
- **<u>NY Not Yet:</u>** The student is still working on one or more objectives

Preschool students are also evaluated on the Success Orientations using the same assessment evaluations listed above for each term.
