The past few weeks at home have been filled with a bit of frustration. My daughter is struggling to get assignments done on time and submitted for grading prior to her progress report showing up in my inbox. As is true with most parents of school-aged children, I am immediately disappointed and then I resort to the standard “playbook” of consequences; taking away electronics, imposing time limitations on everything, and dowling out more household chores. All of this to no avail, creating no change, only

resistance, resentment, and tons of attitude.

I have grown concerned that our competing behaviors will destroy the relationship that I so long to have with my youngest child, my only daughter, and I cannot have this. So, I have decided to focus on understanding and kindness, with the latter being easier to muster than the former.

My focus has shifted to trying to understand her struggle and using what I have learned through my own struggles to help her plan, do, and act. Using what has been learned to emphasize and in turn encourage and motivate for brief moments at a time. But more importantly, to share kindness, letting her know how much she means to me, how despite any momentary shortcomings, how very special she is to me and how her just being herself fills my bucket with joy.

In all honesty, I’m not sure how long this will last or whether or not these “behaviors” on my part can be sustained. I just know that this feels so much better than what I was doing before and it’s worth doing for as long as it can last.



Grades 6-12 Hybrid Learning Has Begun!
