SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Founded in 1970, St. Brendan High School is a comprehensive private four-year Catholic high school enrolling approximately 1,200 students in grades 9-12 in Miami, Florida. The 12th grade class size is 304 students. Students of Hispanic descent comprise 87% of our student population. Female students comprise 65% of our student body, while male students make up 35%. Thirty percent of our student population is on some form of financial assistance. The students at St. Brendan High School are served by administrators, counselors, and 82 instructors. The majority of them hold either a Masters, Specialists, or Doctoral degree. St. Brendan High School is an AP Capstone school, STEM certified by AdvanceD/SACS-CAS1, and accredited by AdvanceD/SACS-CAS1.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

St. Brendan is the only Catholic high school in South Florida offering a comprehensive Academies Program. Academies work similar to college majors, with students enrolling in one of four programs that focus on specific areas: Medical, STEM, Law & Business, and Visual and Performing Arts Academies. St. Brendan offers the Alpha Program for students who have demonstrated high achievement and the Champagnat Program for students with special learning needs. An agreement with European schools allows for the enrollment of a group of Spanish and Italian students, who are hosted by school families. St. Brendan also offers four world languages: Spanish, French, Italian, and Chinese. St. Brendan utilizes a semester academic calendar. Seven credits per semester is the maximum course load. The academic program is organized on a full block schedule, as follows:

Monday – Periods 1 – 7 Tuesday & Thursday – Periods 1 – 4 Wednesday & Friday – Periods 5 - 7

SCHOOL ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES

St. Brendan High School participates in the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA), competing interscholastically in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, lacrosse, swimming, soccer, softball, tennis, track, and volleyball. Students, who meet the academic requirements, are inducted into the 15 Honor Societies offered at St. Brendan. In addition, St. Brendan students have the opportunity to participate in over 30 clubs and organizations, as well as multiple service learning projects on and off campus.

GRADING SYSTEM

Un-weighted GPAs are based on the standard 4.0 point scale. Weighted GPAs are based on the phase level of the course taken. Rank is exact, weighted, and is reported on transcript and school reports.

COVID-19 IMPACTS DURING 2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR

St. Brendan moved towards a 100% virtual platform for the 4th quarter of the 2019-2020 school year. The months and dates impacted were March 17th thru June 3^{rd,} 2020. Summer school was also on a virtual platform through June 30th. The grading scale remained the same, while final exams were not administered or factored into students' final grades. Many Juniors were unable to sit for standardized tests due to testing center cancellations.

COVID-19 IMPACTS DURING 2020-2021 ACADEMIC YEAR

At the onset of this academic year, St. Brendan continues to engage in a 100% virtual learning environment with a transition to full block schedule. Teaching methodology and student learning has shifted due to the longer 90 minute teaching block. Teachers have been encouraged to use alternate forms of assessment to monitor student learning objectives during the virtual learning environment period. In addition, "home" work assignments have been reduced to limit the amount of screen time while learning virtually. The grading scale remains the same with students continuing to earn number grades for their academic performances. Seniors continue to face testing center cancellations due to the high volume of positive COVID-19 cases within Miami-Dade County.

Administration and staff have conducted virtual New Student Orientation, Freshman Parent Orientation, Back to School Night, and Senior College Night with live Q&A's after each virtual event. A mentoring program has been initiated on campus where Seniors have been paired with Freshmen, in order to serve as a "go to" peer buddy as the Freshmen transition into the rigor of high school curriculum. Clubs, school organizations, and honor societies will be launched virtually by the end of September. Students are encouraged to engage in non-contact service opportunities to earn the community service hours required for graduation. Non-contact service opportunities may include packing sandwiches for the homeless, delivering backpacks for low-income students in the community, sending care packages to soldiers.

- St. Brendan's athletic program has implemented Phase I of the "Return to Play" plan for Fall sports. The plan includes outdoor conditioning with no physical contact and limited student participation.
- St. Brendan's "Return to School" plan is fluid and is being evaluated on a weekly basis. St. Brendan is a participating member of the system of schools under the Archdiocese of Miami (ADOM); therefore decisions are ultimately made by ADOM regarding the "Return to School" plan.
