THE DIOCESE AT A GLANCE

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana is composed of 24 counties in the mid-state region with a Catholic population of about 100,000. The Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana has been led by Bishop Timothy Doherty since July of 2010. In addition to shepherding the diocese through a comprehensive pastoral plan involving schools, parishes and faith formation, Bishop Doherty has made it his priority to be with the people in the diocese whenever possible, visiting parishes, schools, and other organizations for a variety of liturgical and non-liturgical events.

The diocese is served by 71 active diocesan priests, 24 retired diocesan priests, and 24 diocesan permanent deacons. There are approximately 25 women religious living in the diocese. The diocese is educating 4,921 students in elementary, middle, and high schools for the 2020-2021 school year. The diocese's religious education programs involve approximately 8,200 elementary and secondary children and youth, including confirmation students.

Governance Structure

The Lafayette Catholic School System operates with a 7-member Board of Trustees and a 12-member Board of Directors, a board of limited jurisdiction. The Superintendent of Catholic Schools and the LCSS Executive Director sit as ex-officio members of each Board. There are Principals at each of the schools who report to the president.

Strategic Plan

The System's current strategic plan, Vision 2030, is the most ambitious in the history of the Lafayette Catholic School System. The plan focuses on facility improvements, program expansion, and sustainable funding models.

Elementary Schools

Children in the elementary grades come to know God through their surroundings and through the lives of others. Whether it be stories from the Bible or learning about lives of the saints as shared by the parish priest, children learn about the God who created them in His image. Exploring their own surroundings and observing the good in their lives teaches that everything comes from a loving God.

Central Catholic Junior-Senior High School

Students at Central Catholic Jr.-Sr. High School develop spiritually by taking theology classes every semester, attending retreats, and performing community service. This makes learning inside and outside of the classroom equally important. Students grow by gaining a deeper understanding of their faith, preparing for college, participating in academic teams, providing service to the community, joining clubs and organizations, playing athletics, singing, making music, creating art, attending events, and supporting special causes.

Liturgy

In addition to Holy Days and special occasions, Mass is celebrated Monday mornings in the junior-senior high school Chapel for staff, parents, and students. All school Masses are held Friday mornings during school time in the McHale Gym.

Reconciliation

Reconciliation is offered every Tuesday in the junior-senior high school Chapel after school and all day on the First Friday of each month. Students also attend Penance Services during Advent and Lent and are encouraged to receive the Sacrament during retreats.





THE POSITION

The President is the chief executive of the operational vitality for the system, including development/advancement, marketing/enrollment, finances, and capital projects, while overseeing all aspects of school life. The President leads and articulates the school's mission and vision, creates and implements strategic plans, and builds and nurtures relationships. He or she reports to and is evaluated by the Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the diocese in collaboration with the Board of Directors.

Duties and Responsibilities

Leadership

- · Articulates and promotes the mission and Catholic identity of the school system
- Works with the Superintendent and Board of Directors and its committees in ongoing assessment and development of the mission of the school system
- Serves as the chief representative of the school system in dealings with the educational, civic, and diocesan communities
- · Hires, supervises, and evaluates principals and oversees faculty and staff

Strategy and Planning

- Develops and updates the strategic plan for the future of the school system, including short- term and long-term goals and objectives.
- · Develops and leads a marketing plan and program to position the school system for increased enrollment and resources

ABOUT THE AREA

Lafayette is a city in and the county seat of Tippecanoe County, Indiana. It is located 63 miles from Indianapolis and 105 miles from Chicago. West Lafayette, on the other side of the Wabash River, is home to Purdue University, which contributes significantly to both communities.

Much of the area's economy centers around the academic and industrial activities of Purdue University, although private industry and commerce independent of the university also exist in the community, with multiple large manufacturing operations in the city employing thousands of workers. Examples include Caterpillar, producer of large diesel and natural gas engines, Subaru of Indiana Automotive, producer of Subaru vehicles, and Tate & Lyle, manufacturer of Splenda and other sweeteners.
