The start of the year brought all the familiar occurrences – and a continuation of the storied SBA traditions and gatherings we all know and love. When students arrived on campus in August, they were joined by a group of new little faces. The inaugural class of SBA's new 3-year-old program had arrived, and with it, a chance to share the SBA community with a new generation of students.

While almost derailed by rain, the Home and School Association pulled off the Fall Fair with fanfare and the annual Monster Mash was a marvelously spooky time.

# MAKING the TRANSITION

As rumblings of the novel coronavirus spread in the early months of 2020, SBA leaders kept a close eye on the escalating situation. They kept in constant contact with infectious disease experts at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (many of whom were SBA parents), and eventually determined that returning to campus after Spring Break was not a safe option.

## Thus began the transition from classroom to virtual learning.

The process of transitioning the SBA curriculum completely online with virtually no warning was not an easy feat. Teachers were tasked with putting a plan together to teach their classes remotely – and quickly. With the help of Google Classroom, they reinvented teaching in just 10 days time. Not only did they succeed in arranging the logistics of remote learning, they also managed to make sure it was as meaningful and engaging as possible.

The initial remote period was intended to last just two weeks. As those weeks stretched on, and as the COVID situation in Nashville and around the country continued to worsen, it became clear in-person instruction could not happen safely for the remainder of the school year. In all, our faculty and students engaged in 9 weeks (or about 222 hours each) of virtual learning.
