

The Big Picture With Fr. Bob



Dear Friends.

"Where there is life, there is hope." I have heard people say this at different times throughout my life. They are words of comfort for anyone going through hard times.

"Where there is life, there is hope". When we say these words in the light of the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead,

they take on a much deeper meaning.

In the light of the Easter morning when Jesus' followers discovered an empty tomb, we can ask along with St. Paul, "Death is swallowed up in victory. Death, where is your victory? Death, where is your sting?" (1 Corinthians 25:54, 55)

The Resurrection of Jesus changes everything! You can glory in the cross of Christ because we know that Good Friday is not the end of the story.

We can live courageous, joyful, loving lives because we share in the power of the Resurrection. Like St. Francis of Assisi, we can view death as "Sister Death" or like Cardinal Bernardin who in his final illness was able to see death as "his friend."

Without the Easter message, St. Francis and Cardinal Bernardin are just talking nonsense. If we cling too much to the values and priorities of a materialistic society, it sounds pretty silly to us as well.

However, Jesus has risen from the dead and we have the best reason to be hopeful and even cheerful in the midst of trials. We are never alone. Our all-powerful, all loving God is always at our side. We are not to be afraid, but rather we are to follow the words of St. Paul: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, Rejoice.' (Philippians 4:4)

These are challenging times for everyone. However, we are not going through it alone. We have a Risen Savior guiding us!

Once a priest asked a college student, "How are you doing today?" The student replied, "Just so, so under the circumstances." The priest replied, "Well, what are you doing under there?" The priest was trying to remind him that we shouldn't let our circumstances dictate whether or not we have peace and joy in our lives.

I'll end with one of my favorite quotes from Saint Teresa of Calcutta: "Never let anything so overwhelm you that you forget the joy of Christ resurrected from the dead." To that I say, Amen. Thanks to the Resurrection of Jesus, we can say in the words of the old spiritual, "Ain't no grave can hold my body down."

To that I say..... Amen! Alleluia!

Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



The students were very curious the last few weeks about why we covered the crucifix and all the statues in the church for the end of Lent. It was certainly striking to walk into our church and see the massive crucifix shrouded in

purple. When talking with one class about it, their teacher shared with me the reason she had been told as a child for the covering of images. She said it was to move us to reflect on what life would be like without Jesus and the saints. Imagine if Jesus had not done what we celebrated over these past few days. Imagine if he had not suffered, died and risen to redeem us. We would still be trapped in sin, living under the dominion of Satan. The gates of heaven would still be closed. Death would be a miserable end, without hope of entrance into glory.

But Christ has died and risen to rescue us from the power of darkness, sin and death. This is why we rejoice on Easter! In the words of the Exsultet: "Christ broke the prison bars of death, and rose victorious from the underworld!" This ancient hymn is sung at the Easter Vigil when the whole church is dark except for the candles the people hold, lit from the paschal candle. It is an incredibly beautiful moment celebrating Christ, the light of the world, who has conquered the darkness and spread his light of grace to us, just as the fire from the paschal candle is spread throughout the Church to each of our candles. The Exsultet calls all of heaven and earth to rejoice because sin has been "destroyed completely by the death of Christ." Easter is a season of victory! "Christ, . . . coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity." Let us live in that light!

As we celebrate the victory of Christ's resurrection, the words of this beautiful chant remind us: "The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners; drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty." May the sanctifying power of Jesus' death and resurrection have this effect in each of our lives. May Christ, the light of the world, dispel the darkness of sadness, sin, and despair. May you be filled with the love, joy, and peace of the risen Christ. Happy Easter!

We will recite the Novena Prayers & Chaplet after every Mass until Divine Mercy Sunday, April 11.

First Day - Friday, April 2 Today bring to Me ALL MANKIND, ESPECIALLY ALL SINNERS, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from It. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion show us Your mercy, that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy for ever and ever. Amen.

Second Day - Saturday, April 3 Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF PRIESTS AND RELIGIOUS, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in men and women consecrated to Your service,* that they may perform worthy works of mercy; and that all who see them may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company of chosen ones in Your vineyard—upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation and with one voice sing praise to Your boundless mercy for ages without end. Amen.

Third Day - Sunday, April 4 Today bring to Me ALL DEVOUT AND FAITHFUL SOULS, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy, You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Receive us into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart and never let us escape from It. We beg this grace of You by that most wonderous love for the heavenly Father with which Your Heart burns so fiercely.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon faithful souls, as upon the inheritance of Your Son. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, grant them Your blessing and surround them with Your constant protection. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Fourth Day - Monday, April 5 Today bring to Me The PAGANS AND THOSE WHO DO NOT YET KNOW ME.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who do not believe in God and of those who as yet do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in You, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Fifth Day - Tuesday, April 6 Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF THOSE WHO HAVE SEPARATED THEMSELVES FROM MY CHURCH.

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son's Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Sixth Day - Wednesday, April 7 Today bring to Me THE MEEK AND HUMBLE SOULS AND THE SOULS OF LITTLE CHILDREN, and immerse them in My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You yourself have said, "Learn from Me for I am meek and humble of heart." Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweet-smelling bouquet before the throne of God; God Himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek souls, upon humble souls, and upon little children who are enfolded in the abode which is the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight You take in them: Bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Seventh Day - Thursday, April 8 Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ESPECIALLY VENERATE AND GLORIFY MY MERCY.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them that during their life, but especially at the hour of death, the souls who will venerate this fathomless mercy of His, He, Himself, will defend as His glory. Amen.

Eighth Day - Friday, April 9 Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ARE DETAINED IN PURGATORY, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You, and yet, who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of Purgatory, that there, too, the power of Your mercy may be celebrated.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg You, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded: Manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way but only through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion.

Ninth Day - Saturday, April 10 Today bring to Me SOULS WHO HAVE BECOME LUKEWARM, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Most compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love, let these tepid souls, who, like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardor of Your love, and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His three-hour agony on the Cross: Let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy. Amen.



The Easter Vigil Explained

Below is a brief guide to the Easter Vigil, along with reflections by Pope Benedict XVI, who frequently meditated on the liturgy during his Easter Vigil homilies.

First Part: The Liturgy of Light (Lucernarium)

The church is shrouded in darkness as a fire is lighted outside the church and the Easter candle is lit from it. The candle represents Jesus Christ, the light of the world. The deacon or priest processes into the dark church and stops three times, proclaiming "Christ, our Light!" By the time he reaches the sanctuary the entire church is blazing with candles that were lit from the Easter candle.

First there is the fire that becomes light. As the procession makes its way through the church, shrouded in the darkness of the night, the light of the Paschal Candle becomes a wave of lights, and it speaks to us of Christ as the true morning star that never sets – the Risen Lord in whom light has conquered darkness.

The Easter Proclamation

When the Easter candle arrives in the sanctuary, the deacon chants the "Easter Proclamation" (also called the Exsultet, from its first word in Latin, "Rejoice"), an ancient hymn that speaks of the many mysteries of this night.

The great hymn of the Exsultet, which the deacon sings at the beginning of the Easter liturgy, points us quite gently towards a further aspect. It reminds us that this object, the candle, has its origin in the work of bees. So the whole of creation plays its part. In the candle, creation becomes a bearer of light. But in the mind of the Fathers, the candle also in some sense contains a silent reference to the Church,. The cooperation of the living community of believers in the Church in some way resembles the activity of bees. It builds up the community of light. So the candle serves as a summons to us to become involved in the community of the Church, whose raison d'être is to let the light of Christ shine upon the world.

Second Part: The Liturgy of the Word

A number of readings are read, still in the darkness of the church. From Genesis through the New Testament, God's marvelous plan is unfolded. The readings are often interspersed with chanted passages or hymns.

The Church wishes to offer us a panoramic view of whole trajectory of salvation history, starting with creation, passing through the election and the liberation of Israel to the testimony of the prophets by which this entire history is directed ever more clearly towards Jesus Christ. In the liturgical tradition all these readings were called prophecies. Even when they are not directly foretelling future events, they have a prophetic character, they show us the inner foundation and orientation of history. They cause creation and history to become transparent to what is essential. In this way they take us by the hand and lead us towards Christ, they show us the true Light.





Third Part: The Baptismal Liturgy

Depending on the circumstances of each parish, a baptismal liturgy is performed. This is the liturgy at which all those who have been preparing to join the Church, or to complete their sacraments as older children or adults, are initiated into the Christian community. The celebration of Baptism (for those who were not Christian) or a Profession of Faith (for those Christians already baptized in a Protestant tradition who are becoming Catholic) and Confirmation takes place at this time. Later on in the Mass, the neophytes, as they are now called, will receive their First Communion.

Regardless of whether someone will be baptized or not, the water of the baptismal font is blessed in order to prepare for those who will be washed clean from their sins and reborn in the death of Christ. Those present renew their baptismal vows.

Baptism is more than a bath, a purification. It is more than becoming part of a community. It is a new birth. A new beginning in life. The passage of the Letter to the Romans which we have just read says, in words filled with mystery, that in Baptism we have been "grafted" onto Christ by likeness to his death. In Baptism we give ourselves over to Christ – he takes us unto himself, so that we no longer live for ourselves, but through him, with him and in him; so that we live with him and thus for others.

Fourth Part: The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The liturgy draws to its culmination and conclusion with the celebration of the holy Eucharist, in which the newly baptized will partake for the first time.

As the day of the liturgical assembly, it is the day for encounter with God through Jesus Christ who as the Risen Lord encountered his followers on the first day, Sunday, after they had found the tomb empty. The structure of the week is overturned. No longer does it point towards the seventh day, as the time to participate in God's rest. It sets out from the first day as the day of encounter with the Risen Lord. This encounter happens afresh at every celebration of the Eucharist, when the Lord enters anew into the midst of his disciples and gives himself to them, allows himself, so to speak, to be touched by them, sits down at table with them.

- Meditation (meditatio). Ponder the words of the passage that stood out to you. Allow yourself to be moved by the Word of God to discover its meaning for your life.
- 4. Prayer (oratio). Speak to God about the passage. Be yourself. Allow time for silence to let God speak back to you. In this prayerful engagement with the Bible passage, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.
- 5. Contemplation (contemplatio): Resting in silence ask, "God, show me the way."







RECIPE OF THE WEEK:

Tortilla Roll-Up

The stone was rolled away! Celebrate with this tortilla roll-up!

- 2 8oz. pkgs cream cheese, softened
- 1 pkg original ranch style salad dressing mix
- 1 sm jar chopped red pimentos, drained
- 1 sm can chopped chilies, drained or 1/2 of a fresh jalapeno pepper, cored and diced
- 1 can ripe olives drained and chopped
- 1 package fajita size flour tortillas

Soften cream cheese in a bowl and mix all ingredients together. Spread the mix on the tortillas and roll the tortilla. Wrap to tighten with saran wrap. Chill overnight or for several hours. To serve, cut in bite sized pieces, about 3/4 inch to serve.

Fun Facts!

The site of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem is identified as the place of the crucifixion and the tomb of Jesus of Nazareth. Today, visitors can enter the cave (which is reserved inside the church) and see the actual place where Jesus rose from the dead. Visitors generally wait in line for 3 - 4 hours to visit the tomb.

Meet Our Extended Family:

St. Cleopas of Emmaus Feast Day - September 25 1st Century

St. Cleopas was one of the disciples who met the risen Lord on the road to Emmaus, and it commemorated in the Roman Martyrology on September 25th. While little is known of either him or his companion, there is a tradition which identifies this Cleopas with the husband of Mary (the mother of James the Lesser). Furthermore, some speculate that he was the brother of St. Joseph, the spouse of the Virgin Mary.

The Gospel of Luke offers a unique post-resurrection narrative of Cleopas and an unnamed traveling companion who were on their way to Emmaus, a town about 7 miles from Jerusalem. The two travelers felt troubled over the recent death of Jesus. They had placed great hopes in Christ and felt confused over his death, yet they were simultaneously amazed over the stories circulating that day about a resurrection. As they walked, they encountered Jesus who interpreted the Scriptures to them in an attempt to help Cleopas and his friend understand the necessity of what had happened. The words of Jesus must have give the two a sense of awe, for as they approached Emmaus, they urged Jesus — whom they still did not recognize -- to stay with them. Jesus agreed, and at the dinner table, he took the bread, blessed it, and gave it to Cleopas and his friend. It was at that moment the two realized that this stranger was Jesus. At the moment of recognition, however, Jesus vanished. Even though it was already evening and getting dark, Cleopas and his companion promptly went back to Jerusalem to share their glorious experience.



Please call the Rectory Office to request this Sacrament. In emergency situations when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

Marriages

Arrangements must be made <u>at least</u> six months in advance and couple must be active, registered members at a Catholic Church. <u>Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a Divine Child priest</u>. Officiant at the ceremony will be a priest from Divine Child unless the couple has someone close to them who is a Catholic priest. Music for the liturgy must be coordinated with our Director of Music Ministry, Mr. Matthew Simpson.

Funerals

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. *Memorial Masses* are scheduled Monday-Friday only.

Baptisms

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism.

The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory Office. Please call Alicia Reyes at 313-277-3110.






