Since 2001, Prep@Pingree has provided opportunities to talented and ambitious middle school students from across Essex County, focusing on the skills necessary to to succeed in middle school, high school, and beyond. Through an innovative year-around academic and cultural enrichment program that challenges students, exposes them to new experiences, and supports them through the transition from middle school to high school, students grow in confidence, expand their worldview, and celebrate their authentically unique talents.

In the last two decades, Prep@Pingree has graduated more than 600 young people. Our graduates have thrived in public, independent, and Catholic schools; earned undergraduate and advanced degrees; joined the workforce; and contributed to the success of our greater community by sharing their stories and their service.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

Prep@Pingree's 19th summer marked by the remarkable resilience and enthusiasm of all in our community, and there is much to celebrate! In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, our incredible faculty successfully transitioned to a comprehensive distance learning program. In line with our goal of sustaining connection over content, students and staff learned from one another, developed close relationships, and honed essential skills for the future.

Highlights from the adapted Prep@Pingree summer program include the following:

- We enrolled 107 students, including 35 from Abbott Lawrence Academy who received transcript credit for their participation
- Held more than 200 virtual courses
- Maintained a daily attendance rate of nearly 100 percent
- Participated in engaging discussions with guests that included a panel of Prep@Pingree alumni and Daniel Rivera, the mayor of Lawrence.

In addition to working with our current Prep@Pingree students, we sustain relationships with Prep@Pingree alumni in college, as well as middle school, high school, and college students, making roughly 50 on-campus visits annually.



WHAT WE DO

ONGOING ACADEMIC AND CULTURAL ENRICHMENT

Once enrolled and at no cost to them, students from our partnering organizations in Lawrence and Lynn are provided everything they need to participate in the program: round-trip transportation from Lawrence and Lynn, meals, and all school supplies. Sponsored and tuition-paying students from other communities are also invited to apply for a small number of available spaces. Each summer, students study math, English, engineering, design, and history for four hours each day, taught by experienced public and independent school teachers assisted by high school student instructors. Classes are supplemented by co-curricular activities like public speaking, interview and application workshops, arts, and athletics, as well

as day trips within greater Boston and Essex County.

We are proud to announce two new initiatives that expand our programming and impact within the community. This year, we will be introducing our Winter Academy, a project-based module focused on examining the immigrant experience in the United States. Additionally, students are invited to participate in our mentorship program, which cultivates relationships between existing Prep@Pingree students and program alumni.

Next year's summer program will begin
July 6, 2021 and end on July 31, 2021.



Organizations include SquashBusters, Gain@GUS, Elevated Thought, and Merrimack Valley YMCA, all of which send students to Prep@Pingree at a cost of \$750 per student.

TUITION-PAYING STUDENTS


