They also enjoyed putting buckets on their heads, just because!




Year 1, Published Authors


















Year 2 Make 'Food Art'












In English, the children had to "paint" a picture for someone else and guide them around a forest using descriptive words and phrases.

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










































































The children weren't the only ones having fun with the Easter Races!

How to enter?

It's super simple...

- 1. Once the masterpiece has been completed, upload it via the online entry form. Remember to include the key information we have asked for above, including first name, age, category, an email address and postcode location.
- 2. Complete the short online entry form by 6 pm on Friday 30 April 2021 unfortunately, we can't accept entries after the closing time.

How will the posters be judged?

We wish that everyone could be a winner, but we only have a limited number of prizes. So, here's the lowdown on what the judges will be looking for:

- Creativity in approach Innovative angle on the content or creative interpretation of the theme
- **Content** Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic
- Effective communication presented and communicated in an engaging way

Members of the British Science Association will shortlist entries, and a panel of judges will select a winner in each category. The two runners up in each category will be uploaded to our Facebook page and the public will decide on a fifth 'popular vote' winner.
